MAXIMUM-GENERAL-FUND-BUDGET-WITHOUT-A-VOTED-LEVY SCHEDULES

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 75-6905, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

#75-6905. Maximum-general-fund-budget-without-a-voted-levy schedules for elementary and high schools. The total amount of the general fund budget of any district shall not be greater than the general fund budget amount specified in the following schedules, except when a district has adopted an emergency general fund budget under the provisions of section 75-6727 or when a district has voted an additional levy under the provisions of section 75-6923.

Elementary School Schedule for 1975-76 1977-78

- (1) For each elementary school having an ANB of nine (9) or fewer pupils. the maximum shall be eight-thousand-six hundred-thirteen-dollars-(\$8562) \$11:066. If said school is approved as an isolated school.
 - (2) For schools with an ANB of ten--(10) pupils, but

less than eighteen-(18) pupils, the maximum shall be eight thousand-six-hundred-thirteen-dollars-(\$8613) \$11,066 plus three-hundred-sixty-dollars-(\$360) \$462,50 per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over nine-191.

- (3) For schools with an ANB of eighteen—(18) pupils and employing one (1) teacher, the maximum shall be eleven thousand—eight—hundred—fifty—three—dollars—(\$11v853) \$15.228 plus three—hundred—sixty-dollars—(\$360) \$462.50 per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over eighteen (18), not to exceed an ANB of twenty—five—(25).
- (4) For schools with an ANB of eighteen-(18) pupils and employing two (2) full-time teachers, the maximum shall be eighteen-thousand-nine-hundred-twenty-four-dollars (\$18,924) \$24,312 plus two-hundred-twenty-five-dollars-and forty-cents-(\$225,40) \$289,60 per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over eighteen-(18), not to exceed an ANB of fifty-(50).
- (5) For schools having an ANB in excess of forty-(40) the maximum on the basis of the total pupils (ANB) in the district for elementary pupils will be as follows:

For a school having an ANB of more than forty-(40) and employing a minimum of three (3) teachers, the maximum of eight—hundred-thirty-six-dollars-and-thirty-cents-(\$836*30) \$1:074 shall be decreased at the rate of eighty-one-cents (\$80) \$1:04 for each additional pupil until the total

number (ANB) shall have reached a total of one-hundred (100) pupils. For a school having an ANB of more than one-hundred (100) pupils, the maximum of seven-hundred reighty-seven dollars and sixty cents (\$707.60) \$1:012 shall be decreased at the rate of seventy four cents (\$474) 95 cents for each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached three hundred (300) pupils. For a school having an ANB of more than three hundred (300) pupils, the maximum shall not exceed six hundred three nine dollars and ten cents (\$609.80) \$821.10 for each pupil.

(6) The maximum per pupil, for all pupils (ANB) and for all elementary schools shall be computed on the basis of the amount allowed herein on account of the last eligible pupil. ANB. All elementary schools operated within the incorporated limits of a city or town shall be treated as one (1) school for the purpose of this schedule.

- (7) For each high school having an ANB of twenty-four (24) or fewer pupils, the maximum shall be forty-nine thousand fifty-one-dollars-(349x051) \$63x035.

- (a) determine the per-ANB schedule amount for the 2 school, as defined by this section, from the high school 3 schedule: 4
 - (b) calculate the ANB for the regularly enrolled full-time pupils enrolled in the seventh (7th) and eighth (8th) grades of the junior high school;
 - (c) multiply the per-ANB schedule amount determined in subsection (a) by the ANB calculated in subsection (b) to determine the authorized general fund budget amount which shall be available for the elementary district general fund budget; and
 - (d) subtract the amount determined in subsection (c) from the total authorized general fund budget amount for the school to determine the authorized general fund budget amount which shall be available for the high school district general fund budget.
 - The general fund budget amount determined for each school of a district under the schedules provided in this section shall be totaled to determine maximum-qeneral-fund-budget-without-a-voted-levy for such district.

- of public instruction will determine the total estimated 2 cost of the special education program for the school district on the basis of a special education argument budget 3 submitted by the district. The budget will be prepared on 4 forms provided by the superintendent of public instruction 5 and will set out for each program
- 7 (a) the estimated allowable costs associated with operating the program where allowable costs are as defined in section 75-7813-1;
- 10 (b) the number of pupils expected to be enrolled in 11 the program; and
- (c) any other data required by the superintendent of 12 public instruction for budget justification purposes and to 13 administer the provisions of this act. The total amount of 14 15 allowable costs approved by the superintendent of public instruction special 16 shall be the education 17 maximum-budget-without-a-vote amount for current year special education program purposes. maximum-budget-without-a-vote for the school year 2 prescribed in this chapter, then subject to the approval of the program by, the superintendent, under the emergency budget provisions of section 75~6723 (5); allowable costs approved under the budgeting provisions of section 75-6905 5 6 (20) for the operation of the program during the given year 7 may be added to the maximum-budget-without-a-vote amount for special education for the subsequent school year. Such costs must be recorded as "previous year special education 9 10 expenses in the school district budget for the subsequent. school year. 11

(22) The sum of the previous year special education expenses as defined in subsection (21) above, and the maximum-budget-without-a-vote for current year special education as defined in subsection (20) shall be the special education budget for accounting purposes.

DESCRIPTION: HB 578 provides for changes in the financial schedules for the maximum general fund budget for elementary and high school districts.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The total average number belonging (ANB) will decline from 171,940 in FY77 to 169,450 in FY78 and 167,460 in FY79.
- 2. The state's taxable valuation will increase from \$1.392 billion in FY77 to \$1.477 billion in FY78 and \$1.636 billion in FY79.
- 3. Total allowable costs for special education will increase from \$20.7 million in FY77 to \$22.0 million in FY78 and \$23.2 million in FY79.
- 4. It is estimated that 11% of special ed. allowance will revert each year, reducing the following year's state equalization payments:

Enactment of the proposed legislation will increase the General Fund requirement for the Foundation Program \$52.6 million over the current requirement, and an additional \$13.1 million in General Fund dollars would be needed for the state share of the Permissive Levy. The Executive Budget recommendation provides \$22.0 million for the Foundation Program over the current requirement and an additional \$5.5 million for the state share of the Permissive Levy.
