A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING A MAJOR FACILITY SITING TASK FORCE; PRESCRIBING ITS DUTIES; APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR ITS SUPPORT."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the earmarked revenue fund, major facility siting account, established under 70-825, the sum of \$80,000 to the department of natural resources and conservation for support of the major facility siting task force established under this act, for the biennium ending June 30, 1979.

Section 2. Siting task force established. (1) There is a temporary commission known as the major facility siting task force, which expires June 30, 1979, composed of 16 members appointed as follows:

- (a) two persons each appointed by the speaker and minority leader of the house of representatives and the floor leader of each party of the senate of the 45th legislature, for a total of eight members; and
- (b) eight members appointed by the governor.
- 24 (2) Of the eight members appointed by the legislators 25 and the governor, respectively, four shall be

representatives of local government, agriculture, industry or public utilities, and environmental organizations, and four shall be individuals with expertise in natural resources and social sciences and citizens unidentified with any particular interest group.

6 Section 3. Duties of the task force. The major 7 facility siting task force shall:

- 8 (1) develop criteria to designate those areas of the 9 state unsuitable for the location of any facility under the 10 Major Facility Siting Act;
- 11 (2) develop criteria to define the characteristics of 12 preferred sites to guide the site selection efforts of 13 future applicants under the Major Facility Siting Act;
- 14 (3) commence the above activities by July 1, 1977, and 15 at its own discretion, hold public meetings during the 16 criteria development process;
- 17 (4) prepare preliminary criteria recommedations by
 18 January 1. 1978, and hold public hearings thereon in the
 19 major population centers of the state and the areas which
 20 would be substantially affected by application of the
 21 criteria;
- 22 (5) submit findings as to unsuitable areas and 23 preferred site criteria to the board of natural resources 24 and conservation on or before October 15, 1978.
- 25 Section 4. Duties of the department of natural

- resources and conservation. The department shall:
- 2 (1) collect the necessary information and utilize
- 3 overlay mapping or such other techniques as it may develop
- 4 at its discretion to apply the criteria developed by the
 - task force to designate those areas of the state unsuitable
- 6 for the location of any facility under the Major Facility
- 7 Siting Act by October 1, 1978;
- 8 (2) compensate the members of the task force, as
- 9 provided by law, for mileage, expenses, and time spent on
- 10 business of the task force;

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- 11 (3) employ such staff or consultants as the task force
- 12 may direct, with necessary furnishings, quarters, and
- 13 supporting services; and
- 14 (4) supply such data and information within its
- 15 possession as the task force may require.
- 16 Section 5. Duty of the board of natural resources and
- 17 conservation. Upon receipt of the findings of the task
- 18 force, the board shall conduct a public hearing in November,
- 19 1978, and, on or before December 15, 1978, adopt as rules in
- 20 the Montana administrative code the criteria and unsuitable
- 21 area delineations recommended by the task force, with such
- 22 modifications as may be supported by sound evidence on the
- 23 record of the hearing.
