House Bill 649 provides additional transportation reimbursement for parents transporting children to schools or bus stops when the parents make multiple round trips.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. 100 families will be eligible for increased reimbursement; $2 / 3$ of the eligible are in the elementary schools; $1 / 3$ are in the high schools.
2. The average mileage paid to those eligible is for ten (10) miles or $\$ 2.04$ per day.
3. Elementary transportation costs are borne equally by state, county and district entities; $2 / 3$ of the high school transportation costs are borne by the county and $1 / 3$ by the state.
