A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH DATA PROCESSING. COMPILATION. AND STORAGE RESPONSIBILITIES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Data processing, compilation, and storage. 10 The department of community affairs shall in cooperation 11 with other governmental and private agencies whenever 12 practicable:

(1) serve as a summary tape processing center for demographic and economic data-base information from federal agencies, including the bureau of census and bureau of economic analysis in the United States department of commerce:

(2) maintain a central depository of statistical, graphic, and other information, including computer-retrievable files, concerning the significant characteristics of the state, its people, economy, land, and physical characteristics, including but not limited to natural resource information concerning soils, topography, vegetation types, wildlife, geology, land capability, and hydrology;

(3) compile and maintain an inventory of state agency data sources from information collected by the department of administration:

(4) publish, on a regular basis, the most recent available statistical and other information, including but 6 not limited to commonly requested social and economic information; directories of trade and technical associations, state manufacturers, research and technology sources; and summaries of federal grants made within the 10 state: and

11 (5) in cooperation with state, federal, and local agencies, compile and maintain land use map data and a land 12 13 use inventory for the state and its subdivisions.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 695 establishes data processing, compilation, and storage responsibilities within the Department of Community

Affairs. Under the proposed legislation, the Department would (1) serve as a summary tape processing center for demographic and economic information from federal agencies, (2) maintain a central depository of statistical information concerning the significant characteristics of the state, (3) compile and maintain an inventory of state agency data sources from information collected by the Department of Administration, (4) regularly publish various social and economic information, directories of trade and technical associations, state manufacturers, and summaries of federal grants, and (5) compile and maintain land use map and inventory data for the state.

ASSUMPTION:

Four (4) additional FTE employees would be required by the Department of Community Affairs Research and Information Division to implement House Bill 695. One (1) Research Analyst position is needed for summaries of federal grants made within the state, plus support costs. Three (3) full-time positions are needed to compile and maintain land use map data and land-use inventory for the state and its subdivisions.
