12 purpose of this appropriation is to enable the department to  
13 compile and maintain land use map data and a land use  
14 inventory for the state and its subdivisions.

In compliance with a written request received February 8, 19 77, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 696 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly.

Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 696 appropriates from the General Fund the sum of \$300,000 for the 1979 biennium to the Department of Community Affairs to compile and maintain land use map data and a land use inventory for the state and its subdivisions.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The funds will be allocated to the Department's Research and Information Division.
2. The funds will be allocated equally between the two fiscal years of the biennium.
3. 3.00 new FTE employees will be required to implement the proposed legislation.
