In compliance with a written request received <u>February 9</u>, 19 <u>77</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 715</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to require the Department of Administration to develop a program of incentives for state employees who save the state time and money and a program to provide for the transfer of appropriate services and functions from the state to the private sector; and to require the Department to report on suggested programs to the legislature in 1979.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- A. Section 1 Incentive Program
 - 1. The Department of Administration would need 1.50 FTE employees to develop a program: A Management Analyst II, and a part-time Secretary I.
 - 2. There are many effective systems in use and only a system adaptation process would be needed, not full systems development costs.
 - 3. No monetary rewards or presentations would be made until after legislative approval by the 46th Legislature.

B. Section 2 - Program to utilize private sector

Section 2 will require an additional 3.00 FTE and related operating expenses and equipment.

Once an incentive program is implemented, it is estimated that an additional analyst will be needed and that the part-time secretary position will become a full-time position.

B. Section 2 - Program to utilize private sector

¹ The fiscal impact of implementing Section 2 is unknown, but it could be substantial. The immediate and ongoing costs of setting up and maintaining an operating staff to review, evaluate and monitor the program to transfer gualifying state activities to the private sector are estimated to run at approximately \$55,000 a year.

The real unknown relates to the immediate and long-term indirect costs that are created because of potential reduced level of service and/or higher unit costs of services received. These intangibles cannot be reasonably estimated.
