 - (7) "Actuarial equivalent" means the accumulated contributions and the present value of the member's state service based on length of service and member's attained age used to provide a life or temporary life income to the legally designated person, based on the person's attained age and sex at the time the option becomes available.
- 20 (8) "Account" means the Montana state game wardens*
 21 retirement account in the agency fund.
- 22 (9) "Involuntary retirement" means a retirement not
 23 for cause and before retirement age.

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(10) "Member's annuity" means payments for life derived from contributions made by the contributor.

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- 1 (11) "Optional retirement age" means the age at which a 2 contributor may retire after twenty (20) years service or 3 more; provided that the contributor has reached the age of 4 fifty-five (55) years.
- 5 (12) "Retirement age" means the age at which a member 6 retires after twenty-five (25) years of creditable service 7 as a state game warden of the department of fish and game. 8 All members must retire at age sixty (60).
- 9 (13) "Retirement allowance" means the state annuity
 10 plus the member's annuity.
- 11 (14) "State annuity" means payments for life derived 12 from contributions made by the state of Montana fish and 13 game moneys in-the-earmerked-revenue-fund."
- Section 2. Section 68-1402, R.C.N. 1947, is amended to read as follows:
- *68-1402. State game warden defined. Whenever used in this act, state game warden means all state fish and game wardens hired by the state fish and game commission and shall include all warden supervisory personnel whose salaries or compensation is paid out of the Montana fish and game moneys in-the-earmerked-revenue-fund.*
- Section 3. Section 68-1405, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 **68-1405. Payments into the Montana game wardens* 25 retirement system. All contributions by the state fish and

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contributions by the state game wardens as designated by section 1 [68-1401] above, in the amount hereinafter specified, and all interest on and increase of the investments and moneys under this account shall be paid to the board, who shall credit such payments to the Montana state game wardens* retirement account in the agency fund. Such board shall have exclusive control of the administration of such account. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the account, subject to the exclusive control 10 11 of the board as to the administration thereof and the board of investments as to the investment thereof. Whenever there 12 13 is on deposit in the Montana state game wardens, retirement account a sum in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars 14 (\$25,000), such excess will be invested by the board of 15 16 investments as part of the long-term investment fund and any of the account less than twenty-five thousand dollars 17 (\$25,000) in amount shall be invested by the board of 18 investments as part of the short-term investment fund when 19 so directed by the Montana game wardens* retirement board.** 20 21 Section 4. Section 68-1407, R.C.N. 1947, is amended to 22 read as follows:

Except as provided in 68-1429. ** 10 all state game wardens shall be members of the retirement system so long as actively employed in that capacity." 11

#68-1410. Contributions by the state of Montana. (a) There shall be paid out of the Montana fish and game moneys in-the-earmorked-revenue-fund, monthly, by the state treasurer, a sum equal to seven per cent (7%) of the total amount of each Montana game wardens* retirement system member's salary, the same to be credited to the retirement account created by this act. (b) The expense of the administration of this act, exclusive of the payment of retirement allowances and other benefits shall be paid by the state of Montana out of the fish and game moneys in--the earmarked--revenue--fund, made on the basis of budgets submitted by the board."

*68-1421. Nomination of beneficiary. Every contributor shall have the authority to name his beneficiary by written designation duly acknowledged and filed with the board. and to change the beneficiary in like manner. Section 7. Section 68-1429, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to 9 10 read as follows:

11 "68-1429. State public employees" retirement systemy 12 -- ineligibility---of---weaper transfer of membership. (11) Each state game warden shall, after July 1, 1963, 13 become a member of this retirement system and thereafter no 14 new state employee appointed as a state game warden shall be eligible to membership to the state public employees! 16 17 retirement system and the provisions of said law shall not 18 apply to Montana state game wardens.

(2) A person who is a member of the retirement system assigned to law enforcement who transfers to a position involving duties other than law enforcement in the fish and game department may retain membership in the retirement SYSTEM BY FILING A WRITTEN ELECTION OF INTENT WITH THE BOARD NO LATER THAN AUGUST 1: 1977: OR NO LATER THAN 30 DAYS AFTER

TRANSFER TO THE NEW POSITION, WHICHEVER IS LATER.

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1 (3) A person who is a member of the public employees. 2 retirement system who transfers to a position as a state 3 game warden may elect to become a member of the retirement 4 system or may retain CONTINUE membership in the public employees* retirement system BY FILING A MRITIEN ELECTION 5 6 OF INTENT WITH THE BOARD NO LATER THAN AUGUST 1. 1977. OR NO LATER THAN 30 DAYS AFTER TRANSFER TO THE NEW POSITION. 7 8 WHICHEVER IS LATER.
