4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE
5	REGULATION AND LICENSING OF ESTHETICIANS."
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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
8	Section 1. Legislative finding and purpose. The
9	legislature finds that the practice of esthetics in Montana
10	affects the public health, safety, and welfare and snould
11	therefore be subject to regulation and control in the public
12	interest. The purpose of this act is to protect the public
13	from the unauthorized, unqualified, or incompetent practice
14	of esthetics.
15	Section 2. Definitions. In this act the following
16	definitions apply:
17	(1) "Esthetics" means:
13	(a) the care and treatment of human skin by means of
19	massage or appropriate machines;
20	(b) the removal of superfluous hair from the human
21	body by the use of cosmetic waxes, depilatories, tweezers,
22	or other devices, but does not include electrology; or
23	(c) massaging, cleansing, treating, manicuring, or

- 2 (3) "Department" means the department of professional
 3 and occupational licensing, provided for in Title 82A,
 4 chapter 16.
- 5 (4) "Approved school" means a school which the board
 6 has approved as having a course of instruction and training
 7 in esthetics which meets the criteria established by board
 8 rule.
- 9 Section 3. Applicability exemptions (1) This act 10 applies only to the practice of esthetics by persons who 11 offer their services to the public.
- 12 (2) This fact does not affect activities of a licensed 13 practitioner of cosmetology, electrology, massage therapy, 14 or any other profession or occupation when such activities 15 are within the scope of the practice of that profession or 16 occupation as defined in the applicable licensing laws.
- 17 Section 4. License required. No person may hold 18 himself out to be an esthetician or practice esthetics 19 unless he holds a valid license granted by the board under 20 this act.
- 21 Section 5. Qualifications of applicants. Applicants
 22 for license to practice esthetics must:
- 23 (1) be at least 18 years of age; and
- 24 (2) furnish evidence, satisfactory to the board, of 25 having completed at least 800 hours of instruction and

- 1 training over a period of not less than 5 months or more
- 2 than 7 months from an approved school.
- 3 Section 6. Examination. The board may require an
- 4 applicant to pass an examination to test his knowledge and
- 5 competency in the field of esthetics before he is granted a
- 6 license.
- 7 Section 7. Rulemaking. The board may adopt rules for
 - the proper administration of this act including but not
 - limited to rules:
- 10 (1) setting forth the criteria for an approved school;
- 11 and

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- 12 (2) setting forth the form, content, and procedure for
- 13 examination of applicants.
- 14 Section 8. Revocation and suspension of license. The
- 15 board may revoke or suspend a license granted under this
- 16 act, if after notice and hearing in accordance with the
- 17 Montana Administrative Procedure Act, it finds a licensee to
 - be incompetent to practice or derelict in the practice of
- 19 esthetics.
- 20 Section 9. Renewal. A license issued under this act
- 21 shall be renewed annually on or before December 31.
- 22 Section 10. Fees -- deposit. (1) The board may charge:
- 23 (a) a fee for application and examination in an amount
- 24 not to exceed \$20;
- 25 (b) a fee for original issuance of license in an

- l amount not to exceed \$30:
- 2 (c) a renewal fee in an amount not to exceed \$40.
- 3 (2) All moneys collected by the department pursuant to
- 4 this act shall be deposited in the earmarked revenue fund
- 5 for the use of the board in the administration of this act.

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
