DESCRISPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

Senate Bill 50 is an act requiring the Department of Community Affairs to collect and compile for publication, twice annually, current statistical information on the social and economic conditions of the state.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The act would become effective July 1, 1977.
- 2. The current staff of the Research and Information Systems Division of the Department of Community Affairs is already collecting and compiling much of the required statistical data.
- 3. The 45th Legislature will authorize a pending budget modification request for the Department of Community Affairs which provides for the federal funding of an Economic Analysis project.
