The superintendent of public instruction board of public education shall give a thirty (30) day 30-day written notification to any person when the board of education intends to consider the suspension or revocation of his certificate. The board of public education shall implement an investigation of the reasons for the suspension or revocation charge and then, if the investigation warrants further action, conduct a hearing in the manner provided by board of public education policies.

After a full investigation and proper hearing, the board of public education may suspend or revoke the person's teacher certificate, except that in cases of a first violation under subsection (3) above, the maximum penalty shall may not be more than a suspension of the person's certificate for the current school fiscal year and the

"75-6318. Reciprocal tuition agreement with adjoining state. Should a district receive more state equalization aid than it is entitled to, the county treasurer must return the overpayment to the state upon the request of the cuperintendent of public instruction board of public education in the manner prescribed by the municipal division of the department of community affairs.
