- 2. In addition to the Historical Society, there are six (6) university units which make up the Historic Records Network.
- 3. The staff of the Archives Program (Montana Historical Society) would increase by four (4) FTEs two (2) archivists and two (2) clerk typists.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The enactment of Senate Bill 72 would require a \$384,613 increase over that currently recommended for the biennium by the Executive Budget as indicated by the following analysis:

- particular, and generally of the region. 16 151 "Historic records network" means an agreement 17 between the Montana historical society and the Montana 18 university system to facilitate exchange and cooperation in 19 the use, acquisition, and preservation of historic records.*
- 20 Section 2. Section 44-523. R.C.M. 1947. is amended to 21 read as follows:
- 22 *44-523. Powers and duties of trustees. The powers and 23 duties of the trustees are as follows:
- 24 (1) Fo to elect annually from among their number a 25 president, a vice-president, and a secretary:

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(2) Fo to adopt bylaws for their own government, and to make rules and regulations, not inconsistent with law, for the proper administration of the society in the interests of preserving the rich heritage of this state and its people.

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- (3) Fo to appoint a director, fix his salary, and prescribe his duties and responsibilities*:
- (4) Fo to create such classes of memberships in the society as they deem desirable, to determine the qualifications for any class of membership, and to set the fees to be paid for such memberships.
 - (5) Fo to sell or exchange publications and other museum or art objects and use the money arising from such sales for the operation of the society and for the acquisition of historical materials and objects of artw:
 - (6) Fo to sell or exchange surplus or duplicate books, surplus museum or art objects or artifacts not pertinent to the region encompassed by the Montana historical society mission and to use the money arising from such sales exclusively for acquisitions of library, art, and museum artifacts.
- (7) To <u>to</u> see that the collections and properties of the society are maintained in good order and repair*:
- 24 (8) Fo to report to the governor and the legislature 25 biennially. The report shall include a statement of all

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- important transactions and acquisitions, with suggestions
 and recommendations for the better realization of the
 purposes of the society and the improvement of its
 collections and services.
- of the society, any gifts, donations, properties, securities, bequests and legacies that may be made to the society. Moneys received by donation, gift, bequest or legacy, unless otherwise provided by the donor, shall be deposited in the state treasury and used for the general operation of the society.
- 12 (10) Fo to collect, assemble, preserve, and display 13 where appropriate, all obtainable books, pamphlets, maps, 14 charts, manuscripts, journals, diaries, papers, business 15 records, paintings, drawings, engravings, photographs, statuary, models, relics, and all other materials 16 17 illustrative of the history of Montana in particular, and 18 generally of the Pacific Northwest, Northern Rocky Mountain 19 and Northern Great Plains regions, and of the United States 20 of America when pertinent; to procure from pioneers, early 21 settlers, and others, narratives of the events relative to 22 the early settlement of Montana, the Indian occupancy, 23 Indian and other wars, overland travel and immioration to 24 the territories of the west, and all other related documents of Montana's history, development and society; to gather 25
