BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 26-1804, R.C.H. 1947, is amended to 12 read as follows:

"26-1804. Investigations by department — regulations — unlawful acts. (1) The department shall conduct investigations on nongame wildlife in order to develop information relating to population, distribution, habitat needs, limiting factors, and other biological and ecological data to determine management measures necessary for their continued ability to sustain themselves successfully. On the basis of such determinations the department shall issue management regulations. Such regulations shall set forth species or subspecies of nongame wildlife which the department deems in need of management pursuant to this section, giving their common and scientific names by species and subspecies. The department shall conduct ongoing

investigations of nongame wildlife. The commission may from
time to time amend such regulations en the approval of the
logicalature as provided for amendments of rules of the
commission by adding or deleting therefrom species or
subspecies of nongame wildlife.

- for proposed limitations relating to taking, possession, transportation, exportation, processing, sale or offer for sale, or shipment as may be deemed necessary to manage such nongame wildlife. The commission may make such changes in the proposed regulations as are consistent with effective management of nongame wildlife as designated by the logislature.
- 14 (3) Except as provided in regulations issued by the counission, it shall be unlawful for any person to take, 15 possess, transport, export, sell or offer for sale nongage 16 17 wildlife deemed by the commission to be in need of management pursuant to this section. Subject to the same 18 19 exception, it shall further be unlawful for any common or 20 contract carrier knowingly to transport or receive for 21 shipment nonque wildlife deemed by the commission to be in 22 need of management pursuant to this section."
- 23 Section 2. Section 26-1805, P.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

- (2) The department shall conduct a review of the state list of endangered species within not more than two-{2}vears from its effective date and every two-42} years thereafter and the commission shall-request the legislature to agend the list-by such additions or deletions as are decard appropriate and at such times are decard appropriate make the changes indicated by this review as provided for amendments of rules of the commission.
- (3) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person to take, possess, transport, export, sell or offer for sale, and for any common or contract carrier knowingly to transport or receive for shipment any species or subspecies of wildlife appearing

on any of the following lists:

- (a) the list of wildlife indigenous to the state 2 determined to be endangered within the state pursuant to a subsection (1);
- (b) any species or subspecies of fish and wildlife 5 included by the commission and appearing on the United States' list of endangered native fish and wildlife as it appears on the effective date of this chapter (part 17 of title 50, code of Federal Regulations, appendix D); and the United States list of endangered foreign fish and wildlife 10 (part 17 of title 50, Code of Pederal Regulations, appendix 11 A), as such list may be modified hereafter; provided, that 12 any species or subspecies of wildlife appearing on any of 13 the foregoing lists which enters the state from another 14 state or from a point outside the territorial limits of the 15 United States and which is transported across the state 16 destined for a point beyond the state may be so entered and 17 transported without restriction in accordance with the terms 18 of any federal permit or permit issued under the laws or 19 20 regulations of another state.
 - (4) In the event the United States' list of endangered native fish and wildlife is modified subsequent to the effective date of this chapter by additions or deletions, such modifications whether or not involving species or subspecies indigenous to the state may be accepted as

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:
Senate Bill 123 amends "The Nongame and Endangered Species Conservation Act" of 1973. The original act provided for the conservation, management and protection of nongame fish and wildlife and species threatened with extinction; and provided the Department of Fish and Game with enforcement authority and penalties for violations.
The proposed legislation removes the statutory provisions that require legislative approval before the Department of Fish and Game can amend Montana's endangered species' lists and management regulations.
FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact is anticipated as the result of the passage and approval of the proposed legislation.
