BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 31-114, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to 12 read as follows:

*31-114. Highway patrol — fees — fines and forfeitures. All fees, fines, and forfeitures collected in any court from persons appreheded or arrested by patrolmen for vicilation of this act and the laws and regulations relating to the use of state highways and the operation of vehicles thereon must be paid to the state treasurer of Montana and by him credited to the general fund of the state, except for that portion of the fines, as provided in section 4 [75-5304] of this act 75-7902, which shall be paid into the automobile driver education account in the earmarked revenue fund and that portion remitted to the local governing body for law enforcement communications; and at the time of payment of any such fee, fine, or forfeiture,

there shall be filed with the state treasurer a complete

statement showing the total of the fees, fines, or

forfeitures received or incurred, which statement shall give

the title of the court and cause and be subscribed to by the

person or officer making such payments.**

Section 2. There is a new R.C.M. section that reads as follows:

Portion of fine for law enforcement communications. A justice court shall remit 20% of all fines and forfeitures 10 collected from persons apprehended by a highway patrolman 11 for violation of any law (other than 32-2144.1, relating to 12 the 55-miles-per-hour daytime speed limit) or rule relating 13 to the use of state highways and operation of vehicles 14 thereon, to the treasurer of the county in which the court is situated. The county treasurer shall deposit these scneys 15 to be appropriated by the governing body of the county for 16 17 law enforcement communications purposes. If primary 18 responsibility for law enforcement communications. particularly the dispatching of highway patrolmen, is 19 exercised by a metropolitan police department in a county, 20 the county treasurer shall pay these moneys to that city or 21 town governing body, which may utilize them for law 22 enforcement communications purposes. 23

A 10 justice court shall remit 20% of all fines and forfeitures 11 collected from persons apprehended by a highway patrolman for violation of any law (other than 32-2144.1, relating to 13 the 55-miles-per-hour daytime speed limit) or rule relating 14 to the use of state highways and operation of vehicles 15 thereon, to the treasurer of the county in which the court 16 is situated. SUCH REMITTANCES MAY NOT RICERD \$25,000 PER 17 YEAR IN A COUNTY. The county treasurer shall deposit these 18 moneys to be appropriated by the governing body of the 19 county for law enforcement communications purposes. If 20 primary responsibility for law enforcement communications, 21 particularly the dispatching of highway patrolmen, is 22 exercised by a metropolitan police department in a county, 23 the county treasurer shall pay these moneys to that city or 24 town governing body, which may utilize them for law enforcement communications purposes.
