4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR SPECIAL  
 5 ALL-BEVERAGES LICENSES FOR AIRPORT FACILITIES."

 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

8 Section 1. Airport all-beverages license. (1) In  
 9 addition to other licenses, the department of revenue may  
 10 issue an airport all-beverages license. An airport  
 11 all-beverages license may be issued to any person which the  
 12 department of revenue approves, authorizing such person to  
 13 sell liquor and beer on the premises of a particular airport  
 14 or air navigation facility. The department of revenue may  
 15 not approve an application for such license unless it  
 16 contains the verified endorsement of the appropriate regional  
 17 or municipal airport authority or, in the case of a state  
 18 airport, of the department of community affairs or of such  
 19 other body as controls the operations of the particular  
 20 airport.

21 (2) In addition to the restrictions on sale or  
 22 transfer of a license provided in 4-4-206, no airport  
 23 all-beverages license may be sold or transferred for  
 24 operation at a location outside the boundaries of the  
 25 airport or air navigation facility for which it was issued.

1 (3) The issuance of airport all-beverages licenses is  
 2 not subject to the quota limitations set forth in 4-4-202.

3 (4) The annual fee for an airport all-beverages  
 4 license is \$800.

5 Section 2. Codification. This act shall be codified as  
 6 a section within the Montana Alcoholic Beverage Code.

## FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request received January 19, 19 77, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for Senate Bill 146 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly.

Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

This bill provides for special all-beverages licenses for airport facilities.

ASSUMPTIONS

1. The new liquor license on airports will cost \$800.
2. 3 airports currently serve liquor - Billings, Butte and Great Falls.
3. The only additional airports that would have a liquor license are those currently served by major scheduled airlines. These additional airports total 11 and include Missoula, Kalispell, Helena, West Yellowstone, Bozeman, Havre, Wolf Point, Sidney, Glendive, Miles City and Lewistown.
4. All airports listed in assumption 3 would purchase licenses.
5. No additional airports would sell liquor throughout the biennium, under the current law.
6. Administrative costs would remain unchanged.
