 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE
 5 SALARIES OF JUSTICES OF THE PEACE SHALL BE DETERMINED
 6 ACCORDING TO THE SCHEDULE IN SECTION 25-605, R.C.M. 1947;
 7 REPEALING SECTION 93-413, R.C.M. 1947."

 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
 10 Section 1. Section 25-605, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to
 11 read as follows:

12 "25-605. Salaries of certain county officers. The
 13 salaries of justices of the peace, county treasurers, clerk
 14 and recorder, clerk of the court, county attorneys,
 15 sheriffs, county superintendents of schools, and of county
 16 surveyors in counties where county surveyors now receive
 17 salaries as provided in section 16-3302, shall be based on
 18 the population and taxable valuation of the county in
 19 accordance with the following schedule:

2 The total salary paid to justices of the peace, county
3 treasurers, clerk and recorder, clerk of the court, county
4 attorneys, sheriffs, county superintendents of schools and
5 county sheriffs, and county surveyors in counties where
6 county surveyors receive salaries, as provided in section
7 15-330z, shall be the sum of the salary shown in column A
8 based on population when added to the salary shown in column
9 B based on taxable valuation; provided, however, that county
10 superintendent of schools shall receive, in addition to the
11 salary based upon the totals of columns A and B above, the
12 sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) per year and county
13 sheriffs and county attorneys shall receive, in addition to
14 the salary based upon the totals of columns A and B above,
15 the sum of one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200) per
16 year. Notwithstanding the above, in each county with a
17 population in excess of thirty thousand (30,000) the salary
18 of the county attorney shall be twenty-five thousand dollars
19 (\$25,000) per year."

20 Section 2. Repealer. Section 93-413, R.C.M. 1947, is
21 repealed.

In compliance with a written request received January 25, 19 77, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for Senate Bill 267 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly.

Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 267 places Justices of the Peace on the county salary schedule established in Section 25-605, R.C.M. 1947. The salary schedule is based upon the population and taxable valuation of the respective county.

ASSUMPTION:

All Justices of the Peace, whether full- or part-time, would be paid in accordance with the salary schedule established in Section 25-605.

TECHNICAL NOTE:

The proposed legislation would compensate all Justices of the Peace, whether full- or part-time, for a normal 8-hour working day. In Montana, over one-half of all Justices of the Peace currently work less than an 8-hour day.
