Senate Bill 271 (Third Reading) provides an annual ten percent ( $10 \%$ ) increase in the financial schedules for the maximum General Fund budgets without a vote for elementary and high school districts.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The total average number belonging (ANB) will decline from 171,940 in $F Y 77$ to 169,460 in $F Y 78$ and 167,460 in $F Y$
2. The state's taxable valuation will increase from $\$ 1.392$ billion in $F Y 77$ to $\$ 1.477$ billion in $F Y 78$ and $\$ 1.566$ billion in FY 79.
3. Total allowable costs for special education will increase from $\$ 20.7$ million in $F Y 77$ to $\$ 22.2$ million in $F Y$ ( $\mathbf{7 8}$ and $\$ 23.8$ million in FY 79.
4. It is estimated that eleven percent (11\%) of special education allowance will revert each year, reducing the following year's state equalization payments.

Laws of Montana, 1965-Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

NOTE: Funding requirements differ somewhat from previous fiscal notes on foundation program bills because of revenue estimates revisions which have been agreed to by the Office of Budget and Program Planning and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

NOTE: Even with the revised revenue estimates the Legislative Fiscal Analyst funding requirements remain $\$ 6.22$ million in excess of the $\mathbf{\$ 2 3 . 9}$ million deficiency shown on this note. In other words, based on the assumptions used by the Legislative Fiscal Analyst, SB 271 as amended would require $\$ 30.12$ million more general fund money for full funding than is contained in the Executive Budget.

Enactment of the proposed legislation will increase the General Fund requirement for the Foundation Program $\$ 48.2$ million over the current requirement, and an additional $\$ 12.0$ million in General Fund dollars would be needed for the state share of the Permissive Levy. The Executive Budget recommendation provides $\$ 22.0$ million for the Foundation Program over the current requirement and an additional $\$ 5.5$ million for the state share of the Permissive Levy.
