10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 75~6905, R.C.N. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

*75-6905. Maximum-general-fund-budget-without-a-voted
-levy schedules for elementary and high schools. The total
amount of the general fund budget of any district shall not
be greater than the general fund budget amount specified in
the following schedules, except when a district has adopted
an emergency general fund budget under the provisions of
section 75-6727 or when a district has voted an additional
