Section 1. Section 26-202, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to
read as follows:
-26-202. License required. Ll It shall be unlawful
and a misdemeanor punishable as provided by section 26-324
for any person to pursue, hunt, trap, take, shoot, kill or
attempt to trap, take, shoot, or kill, any game anfwal or
any game bird, or any fur-bearing animal, or to take. kill,
trap or fisn. for any fish within this statey or to havep
kaep or possess within this state, any game animal, game
bird, fur-bearing animal, or game fish, or parts thereof,
except as herein provided or shall be provided by the state
fish and game commission, of for any person to pursue, hunt,
trap, take, shoot or kill, or attempt to trap, take, shoot
or kill, any game animal, game bird, or fur-bearing animal,
or take, kill, trap, or fish for, any fish except at the
places and during the periods and in the manner herein
defined or shall be defined by the state fish and game
commission, or for any person to pursue, nunt, trap, take, shoot or kill, or attempt to trap, take, shoot or kill, any game animal, game bird, or fur-bearing animaly or take, kill, trap, or fish fort any fish within this state, or have, keep; possess, selly purchase, ship or reshipy any inported or other fur-bearing animalp: or parts thereof. without first having obtained a proper license or permit frow the comilission so to do.

Section 2. Section 26-202.1, R.L.A. 1947. is amended o read as follows:
-26-202.1. Licenses -- fees -- classifications of licenses - fees and powers under licenses. (1) CJass License-Resident fishing License. Any resident as defined by section 26-202.3. upon payment of a fee of five dollars (55) Shall receive a Class $A$ license which shall entitle the holder thereof to fish with hook and line or rod as authorized by regulations of the comission.
(2) Class A-1 licanse--Resident Game bird License. Except as herein provided, any resident as defined by section 26-202.3, who is twelve (12) years of age or older. may, upon payment of a fee of four dollars (\$4) receive a

Class A-l license, which will entitle the holder to pursue, hunt, shoot and kill game birds and possess the dead bodies of game birds which are so authorized by regulations of the commission.
(a) No hunting licenses shail be issued to any resident person under the age of eighteen (18) years unless he presents to the person authorized to issue such license a certificate of competency as provided by this section.

The department of fish and game shall provide for a course of instruction in the safe handing of firearms and for the purpose may cooperate with any reputable association or organization having as one of fts objectives the promotion of safety in the handiong of firearmse The department may designate any person found by it to be competent to give instructions in the handing of firearms. A person so appointed shall give such course of instruction and upon the successful completion thereaf shall issue to the person instructed a certificate of competency in the safe handling of firearms.
(3) Class A-2 License--Special Bow and Arrow License. A holder of any one of the following: a Class A-3, A-4, A-5, 8-2, B-5, B-6, B-7, B-8, or B-10 license, may upon payment of an additional sum of six dollars (\$6) to any agent of the fish and game comission authorized to issue fishing and hunting licenses be entitled to a Class A-2 license, which
shall authorize the holder thereof to pursue, hunt, sioot, and kill the game animals autnorized by the licenses held with bow and arrow and to possess these carcasses during special seasons, and in special areas, as may be designated by the fish and game comission.
(4) Class A-3, A-4, A-5, A-6 Licenses. Any resident as defined by section 26-202.3 who is twelve (12) years of age or alder, may upon payment of the proper fee or fees be entitled to purchase one each of the following licenses: Class A-3, Deer A Tag, six dollars (\$6) for the license year beginning May 1, 1976, and seven dollars (\$7) for each license year thereafter; Class A-4, Deer B Tag, twelve dollars (\$12); Class A-5 Elk Tag, eight dollars (\$8); Class A-6, Black or Brown Bear Iag* six dollars (\$6); which will entitle:the holder to pursue, hunt, shoot, and kill the game animal or animals authorized by the license heid and to possess the dead bodies of game animals of the state which are so authorized by the regulation of the commission.
(S) Class B License-Nonresident Fishing License. Any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3, upon payment of the sum of twenty doliars (\$20) to any agent of the fish and game comission authorized to issue fisting and hunting licenses, shall be entitled to a Class B ifcensep which shall entitle the holder thereof to fish with nook and line as authorized by the rules and regulations of the

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comatission
(6) Class 3 -1 License--Nonresident Game Bird License. Except as herein provided, any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3, but who is twelve (12) years of age or older, upon payment of the sum of thirty dollars (\$30) to any agent of the fisin and game commission authorized to issue fishing and hunting licenses shall be entitled to a Class b-i licensey which shall entitle the holder thereof to pursue, hunt, shoot, kill and possess game birds as authorized by the rules and regulations of the commission.
No munting licenses shall be issued to any nonresident person under the age of eighteen (18) years unless he presents to the person authorized to issue such license a certificate of competency as provided in section 26-202.1(2)(a) or a certificate verifying that he has successfully completed a course in the safe nanding of firearms in any state or province.
(7) Cilass B-2 License-Nonresident Combination License. Within the limitations of this section or any commission rule, any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3, but who is twelve (12) years of age or older, upon the payment of fifty dollars (550) may apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana for a Class B-2 license, and nonresident conservation license as prescribed
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in section 26-230, which shall authorize the nolder to pursue, hunr, shoot; kill and possess gase birds, and to fish with nook and line as authorized by the rules and regulations of the comnission, and to purchase additional and special licenses and tags as provided by law or comission regulation.
(B) Class B-3 License--Temporary Nonresident or Tourist fishing License. Any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3, upon payment of the sum of ten dollars (\$10) to any agent of the fish and gane comission authorized to issue fishing and hunting licenses, shall be entitled to a temporary nonresident fishing license, which shall authorize the holder to fish with hook and ine as authorized by the rules and regulations of the fish and gome commission for a period of six (6) days inclusive of the dates indicated on the license.
(9) Class B-5 License--Nonresident Deer License. Any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3, but who is twelve (12) years of age or older and a holder of a nonresident conservation license, upon the payment of the sum of fifty dollars ( $\$ 50$ ) shall be entitled to a Class $9-5$ license which shall authorize the holder to pursue, nunt, shoot, and kill one (1) deer in the area or areas designated in the license, as determined by the compission* and to possess the carcass of same.
(10) Class 8-6 License--Nonresident Antelope License. any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3. but who is twelve (12) years of age or older and a holder of a Class B-2 nonresident combination license, upon the payment of the sum of fifty dollars ( 550 ) shall be entitled to a Class B-6 license which shall authorize the holder to pursue, hunt, shoot, and kill one (1) antelope in the area designated in the iicense; as determined by the commission, and to possess the carcass of same.
(11) Class B-7 and B-B. Licenses. Any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3, but who is tyelve (12) years of age or older, and is a holder of a B-2 nonresident combination license, may upon payment of the proper fee or fees and subject to the 7 imitations prescribed by law and commission regulation be entitled to apply to the Fish and Game Office, Helena, Montana, to purchase one each of the following licenses: Class B-7, Deer A Tag. fifty dollars (\$50); Class $B-$ P $_{\text {, }}$ Deer $B$ Tag, fiftr dollars (550); and will entitle the hoider to pursue, bunt, shoot, and kill the game animal or animals authorized by the license held and to possess the dead bodies of game animals of the state which are so authorized by the regulations of the commission.
(12) $\mathrm{B}-10$ nonresident big game combination $\mathbf{l i c e n s e}$. Any person not a resident as defined in section 26-202.3,
R.C.M. 1947, but who is twelve [12] years of age or older may, upon payment of the proper fee or fees and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and comission rejulation, be entitled to apply to the fish and game office, Helenap Montana, to purchase a b-10 nonresifent big game combination license for two nundred twenty-five dollars (\$225) which shallentitle the holder to all the privileges of a $B-2$ monresident combination license, a deer $A$ tag, and elk tag and a black bear license. This license includes the nonresident conservation license as prescribed in section 26-230, R.C.H. 1947.
(13) Special licenses. Any applicant wno is twelve (12) years of age or older and is a resident as defined by section 26-202.3, or any applicant who is the holder of a Class B-2 nonresident combination license may apply for a special license, which in the judgment of the fish and game commission, is to be issued and shall pay the following fees therefor:

Moose, resident twenty-five dołlars (\$25), nonresident one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125):

Mountain Goat, resident fifteen dollars (sis) nonresident seventy-five dollars (575);

Mountain sheep, resident twenty-five dollars (525), nonresident one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125);

Antelope, resident five dollars (\$5):

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Grizzly Bear. resident twenty-five dollars (\$25), nonresident one hundred twenty-five dollars (5125);
Black or brown bear, nonresident fifty dollars (\$50)-
In the event a holder of a valid special grizzly bear license kills a grizzly bear, he must purchase a trophy license for a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) within ten (10) days after date of kill. Such trophy license shall authorize the holder to possess and transport said tropiy.
In the event that the number of valid resident applications for licenses exceeds the number of licenses which the fish and game comission desires to issue in any hunting district, then the number of licenses issued to nonresident license holders in that hunting district shall not exceed ten per cent (10\%) of the total issued.
(14) Class \(C\) License--Trapper*s License. Any resident as defined in section 26-202. 3, upon making application and paying the sum of ten dollars (\$10) to the fish and game commissiong shall be entitled to a trapper's license, which shall autharize the holder thereof to trap fur-bearing animals, within the state of Montana at such times and in such manner as may be lawful so to do under the laws of the state and the regulations of the fish and game commissiont and at such places as may be designated in said license.
(15) Class C-1 License--Landowner's Trapping License. Any owner or tenant, or member of the immediate family of
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said owner or tenant, upon making application to the fish and game commission, and upon payment of the sum of one dollar (sl) shall be entitled to a landowner's trapping license which shall entitle the holder thereof to trap any fur-bearing animal on land owned or leased by hime or his immediate family, at such times and in such manner as may be lawful so to do under the laws of the state and the regulations of the fisti and game comimsion and at such places as may be designated in said jicanses.

(tot(17) Exception. (a) A resident under the definition of section 26-202.3. who is sixty-two (62) years or alder shall be entitled to fish and hunt game birds with a conservation license issued by the state fishand game commission for a fee of one dollar (\$1). The form of such license shall be prescribed by the fish and game comission.
(b) Any veteran who is a patient residing at a hospital operated by the veterans administration. within or outside the statey and residents of all institutions under the jurisdiction of the state board of institutions, except the Montana state prison at Deer Lodge, will be entitled to fish without a license. Such residents shall carry a perwit on a fors prescribed by the commission and signed by the superintendent of the institution in lieu of a license.
(c) Disabled persons are entitled to fish without a license, if they are residents of Montana not residing in an institution and are certified as disabled by a licensed medical doctor, licensed to practice medicine in Montana-

Disability is defined as a physical or mental condition that prevents a person frow doing any substantial gainful work that is expected to last for the rest of their life.

Such disabled persons shall carry a permit on a forim prescribed by the commission.
(d) If a person is convicted of a violation of the fish and game laws or regulations of Montanas the privilege conferrad by this subsection shall be revoked for not less than six (6) months.
(e) Residents, as defined by section 26-202.3, under the aye of fifteen (15) years may purchase Class A-1, A-3, and A-5 licenses at two dollars (\$2) per license.
(f) The commissiong by rule or regulation may
prescribe the number of Class $8-5$ and $\mathrm{B}-6,8-7,8-8$, or $=-10$ licenses to be issued in each of the hunting districts designated by it. Any license sold may be restricted to a specific hunting area and may specify the species, age, and sex to be taken in order to insure the proper management and propagation of game animals in these areas, provided, however, that no number limit shall be placed on 5-7, 3-8 and $\mathrm{s}-10$ license by area except in major hunter concentration areas as determined by the comission. Not more than seventeen thousand (17,000) nonresident big game combination licenses $(B-10)$ may be soldin any one license year.
(9) Special antelope licensas. In the event the number of valid applications for special antelope licenses for a hunting district exceeds the quota set by the comaission for the district, such licenses shall be awarded by a drawing. Persons making valid application who did not receive an antelope license during the season immediately preceding the drawing shall be given first preference in such drawing for first, second and third choice hunting districtse The commission shall have the authority to promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary to implement this subsection.
(h) Special elk permits. In the event the number of valid applications for spacial elk peraits for a nunting
district exceeds the quota set by the commission for the district. these permits shall be awarded by a drawing. Persons making valid application who did not receive a special elk permit during the season immediately preceding the drawing shall receive first preference in this drawing for first, secondy and third choice hunting districts. The commission may promulgate the rules necessary to implement this subsection.
t+f(18) Only one (1) license of any one (1) class, except Class $\mathrm{B}-3$ and $\mathrm{B}-4$ licenses: shall be issued to any one (1) person, provided, however, that the comission may prescribe rules and regulations for the issuance or sale of a replacement license of the same class in the event the original license is lost, stolen or destroyed upon payment of the sum of one dollar (\$1).
t¥bicl9) Class AAA License--Sportsman's License. Any resident, as defined by section 26-202.3, who is twelve (12) years of age or older, upon payment of the sun of thirty-five dollars (\$35) shall be entitled to a sportsman" 5 license which shall permit the holder to exercise all rights granted to holders of Class $A, A-1, A-3, A-5, A-6$ and resident conservation licenses as prescribed in section 26-230. The comaission shall furnish each holder of a sportsman's license an appropriate decal.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 342 is an act to regulate the nonresident trapping of Montana fox and coyote by requiring a $\$ 225$ nonresident coyote--fox trapper's license. Nonresident coyote-fox trapping season is established from November 1 to April 1 each year.

## ASSUMPTION:

1. Approximately 30 such trappers' licenses would be issued each year.
2. No additional operating costs will be incurred.
