*66-1516. Physicians to report prescriptions issued to drug addicts. (11) A duly licensed physician duly licensed to practice medicine in Montana, who prescribes for, dispenses, administers, or in any manner gives any of the drugs mentioned in this act, to a person known to him or believed by him to be an habitual user or a drug addict, snall, within forty-eight hours, report to the county attorney of the county in which said physician prescribes for, dispenses, administers, or in any manner gives any of the drugs mentioned in this act, the name, address, physical and mental condition, and any necessary substantial information regarding such person. "An habitual user of such grugs" or
