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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AUTHORIZING A PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO ESTABLISH AN EQUIPMENT RESERVE FUND FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING OR REPLACING MAJOR ITEMS OF INSTRUCTIONAL EQUIPMENT AND PROVIDING A METHOD OF FINANCING."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Instructional equipment reserve fund — establishment. The trustees of any public school district may establish an equipment reserve fund for the purpose of future purchase or replacement of major items of equipment needed for instructional purposes. In order to establish the equipment reserve fund, the trustees of the district must pass a resolution that specifies:

- 18 (1) the purpose or purposes for which the equipment is 19 to be used:
- 20 (2) the period of time for which the equipment reserve
  21 fund is to be established; and
- 22 (3) the total amount of money that is to be raised
  23 over the specified period of time.
- 24 Section 2. Equipment reserve fund -- transfer from 25 general fund. Whenever an equipment reserve fund has been

established, the trustees may transfer into such fund from
the district general fund an amount not to exceed the
unexpended budget allocation for new equipment as of June 30
the then current school fiscal year.

Section 3. Authority to expend moneys — reversion of surplus to general fund. The trustees of a district maintaining an equipment reserve fund may expend money from the fund for the purpose for which it was established when, in their judgment, there is sufficient money to make such purchases. If the amount of money in the fund exceeds that needed for the authorized purpose, the surplus reverts to the district general fund.

Section 4. Right of investment. Whenever money is credited to the equipment reserve fund for which there is no immediate need, the trustees may invest such money in accordance with 75-6806(4).

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
