# FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request received <u>March 7</u>, 19 <u>77</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 436</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

# DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 436 provides for a county resource corps for persons receiving public assistance, unemployed persons and volunteers.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. The Department of Labor will not be required to provide administrative support to these projects.
- 2. All funds required will be county funds.
- 3. Public assistance recipients excluded from work will follow current WIN guidelines for General Assistance and AFDC programs (AFDC adults eligible 20%; General Assistance eligible 100%).
- 4. 25% of the eligible public assistance recipients will participate.

5. Maximum expense allowance for travel and out-of-pocket expenses would be \$35 per month.

## FISCAL IMPACT - LOCAL GOVERNMENT:

The total fiscal impact of the proposed legislation cannot be estimated at this time as the fiscal impact due to those persons receiving unemployment benefits, as well as the savings and the value of the benefits derived from the corps, is unknown. The additional cost to counties for persons receiving public assistance is estimated to be \$83,000 per year.

### TECHNICAL NOTE:

The Employment Security Division suggests that Section 7 of the proposed legislation may be in conflict with federal regulations related to unemployment compensation benefits.

Short title. This act may be cited as "The 10 Hontana County Resource Act of 1977\*. 11 Section 2. Purpose. Because the legislature believes 12 in the work ethic and in promoting creative job 13 opportunities and work experiences for persons receiving 14 public assistance, persons who are unemployed, and other 15 volunteers who seek constructive activity, the purpose of 16 this act is to authorize counties to create a county 17 resource corps to work on projects improving the quality of 18 life and the environment in counties and in communities 19 within counties and to provide creative job opportunities 20 and work experiences for persons receiving public 21 assistance, unemployed persons, and other volunteers who 22 seek constructive activity. 23

24 Section 3. County authorized to create county resource 25 corps. A county may create a county resource corps composed

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of persons receiving public assistance, unemployed persons, 1 and other volunteers who seek constructive activity. The z purpose of the corps shall be to work on projects improving 3 the quality of life and the environment in the county and in 4 5 communities within the county. 6 Section 4. County resource corps projects. (1) 411 7 projects to be performed by a county resource corps shall be 8 planned to give participants creative job opportunities and 9 work experiences and to provide participants with a sense of 10 accomplishment. 11 (2) In planning a project, a county shall give special 12 emphasis to projects which: (a) help low-income people; and 13 (b) help beautify the county and the communities 14 15 within the county. (3) County resource corps projects may involve but are 16 not limited to: 17 (a) helping to care for and to provide recreational 18 opportunities for mentally retarded persons; 19 20 (b) helping to care for and to provide recreational opportunities for senior citizens; 21 (c) helping to provide children with recreational 22 facilities and opportunities; 23 (d) helping child day-care centers; 24

25 (e) helping to winterize homes;

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1 (f) helping to conserve natural resources; and (g) helping the county and the communities within the county pursuant to suggestions from schools, parks, citizen action programs, and other concerned citizen groups.

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5 (4) In planning a county resource corps project, a county shall seek the advice of low-income people, from 6 7 persons who would be involved in the project, and from the department of community affairs. 8

Section 5. Participation in county resource corps 9 10 projects. (1) A county resource corps shall be open to all 11 persons who desire to participate in county resource corps 12 projects.

13 (2) Public employment offices under the Montana state employment service shall--encourage--but may not require 14 15 unemployed persons to participate in county resource corps 16 projects.

(3) A county welfare department, acting pursuant to 17 quidelines established by the department of social and 18 19 rehabilitation services, may require an employable recipient of public assistance benefits to participate in county 20 resource corps projects for no more than 80 hours a month, 21 provided: 22

23 (a) the recipient is given the right to request a 24 hearing on the matter before the board of social and 25 rehabilitation appeals;

1 (b) the recipient is free to search for and accept 2 other employment at any time; and 3 (c) the county resource corps projects are planned to 4 give participants creative job opportunities and work 5 experiences and to provide participants with a sense of 5 accomplishment. (D) \_SUCH\_\_PARTICIPATION\_SHALL\_NOT\_INTERFERE WITH\_OTHER 7 TRAINING OR WORK INCENTIVE AND EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS. 8 9 (4) COUNTIES SHALL ATTEMPT AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE TO 10 DEVELOP ANY SUCH JOBS INTO BONA FIDE EMPLOYMENT. EITHER ON A 11 PART-TIME OR FULL-TIME BASIS. 12 Section 6. County resource corps basically a volunteer 13 program. Except in the case of employable recipients of 14 public assistance benefits required to participate in county 15 resource corps projects, participation in such projects is 16 strictly on a voluntary basis. However, participants shall 17 be reindursed for their travel expenses and other 18 out-of-pocket expenses incidental to their participation. 19 Section 7. Credit for state employment to be given. 20 Participants in county resource corps projects shall be given credit for state employment equal to the average 21 22 number of hours of participation a month. Participants

Section 8. Workers' compensation coverage. A county

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equal to at least 120 hours shall receive full-time credit.
