Section 19, Chapter 157, Laws of 1977, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "Section 19. There is a new R.C.M. section numbered 12 13 11-2020.1 that reads as follows: 14 11-2020.1. Definitions. Unless the context requires otherwise, the following definitions apply in 11-2020 15 through 11-2031, 11-2020.2, and 11-2024.1: 16 (1) "Board of administration" means the board of 17 18 administration of the public employees' retirement system. 19 (2) "Division" means the division of workers" compensation of the department of labor and industry. 20 (3) "Fire company" means a fire company organized in 21 an unincorporated area, town, or village under the laws of 22 23 the state of Montana. 24 (4) "Fund" or "volunteer firemen's fund" means the 25 volunteer firemen's compensation earmarked--revenue account INTRODUCED BILL

2 Section 2. Section 1. Chapter 95, Laws of 1977, is amended to read as follows: 3

"Section 1. Section 11-2022; R.C.M. 1947; is amended 4 S. to read as follows:

*11-2022. Disability, death, insurance and pension 6 7 benefits. 1. Every member of a fire company organized in an 8 unincorporated area, town or village under the laws of this 9 state, shall be entitled to receive compensation for disability incurred while in the performance of his duties 10 11 as such fireman, when such disability necessitates the 12 services of a physician or surgeon, while confined or nonconfined, in the amount of his necessary and reasonable 13 medical expenses resulting directly from such disability, 14 15 and incurred within a period of not more than thirty-six 16 (36) months from the date of the injury which caused such 17 disability, not to exceed a total of twenty-five thousand 18 dollars (\$25,000).

19 2. Where an injury incurred in line of such duty 20 results in the loss by amputation of an arm, hand, leq or 21 foot, or the enucleation of an eye, or the loss of any of 22 the natural teeth, the board shall order them an artificial 23 member or members be furnished to supply the loss thereof. 24 The expense of furnishing such members shall not exceed the 25 sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500). The

replacement of an artificial member so furnished shall be

2 required every five (5) years, if necessary.

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3 3. To aid in defraying funeral expenses of a fireman
4 covered under this act whose death occurs in line of duty;
5 an amount not to exceed the actual necessary and reasonable
6 expenses, or the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars
7 (\$1,500), whichever is less, shall be allowed.

8 4. To encourage and aid volunteer fire departments to 9 maintain group insurance for benefits on account of death or 10 injury incurred by members while in the performance of 11 duties as volunteer firemen, the sum of seventy-five dollars 12 (\$75) per year for each mobile unit of fire-fighting 13 equipment, not exceeding two (2) such units in number for 14 any such department, shall be paid to each volunteer fire 15 department maintaining such insurance, or to the organization or agency maintaining such insurance for any 16 17 such volunteer fire department.

18 5. In the case of every volunteer fireman who shall 19 ageet the qualification requirements set forth in 20 subparagraph two (2) of section 11-2023, and then if the claim provided for under subparagraph two (2) of section 21 22 11-2024 shall be completed and filed, the claimant shall be entitled thereafter to participate in the volunteer 23 24 firemen's pension plan as provided in this act, and to 25 receive payments thereunder computed each year in the

1 following manner. Whenever at the close of business on the 2 last day of any fiscal year there shall be a balance in the 3 volunteer firemon's--compensation--account--in--the--agency 4 firemen's fund in excess of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) 5 then the industrial accident board shall set aside and pay over to the public employees' retirement system, the smaller 6 7 of such amount in excess of one million dollars (\$1+000+000), or an amount equal to ninety-five percent 8 (95%) of the increase of said account balance over the 9 account balance at the end of the preceding fiscal year, for 10 11 the payment by said public employees' retirement system of 12 pensions to qualified claimants during the immediately 13 succeeding fiscal year. The amount to be paid to each qualifying claimant shall be determined by dividing said 14 amount set aside by the number of claimants qualifying to 15 16 participate in such pension plan at the beginning of such 17 succeeding fiscal year. If such amount set aside shall be 18 sufficient to pay each such gualified claimant at least 19 twenty dollars (\$20) per month throughout such succeeding 20 fiscal year, then such pension shall be paid monthly, on or 21 before the last day of each month of such succeeding fiscal 22 year; but if said amount set aside shall not be sufficient to pay each qualified claimant at least twenty dollars (\$20) 23 24 per month, then each qualified claimant's full pension for that year shall be paid to him in one lump payment on or 25

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before the fifteenth day of December of such year; provided, 1 however, that in any event the total pension payable 2 3 hereunder to any gualified claimant shall not exceed the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) per month, and the amount to be set 4 5 aside hereunder from the volunteer firemon's-compensation 6 account-in-the-agency firemen's fund at the beginning of any 7 fiscal year for the funding of such pensions shall not in 8 any event exceed the amount necessary to pay such maximum of fifty dollars (\$50) per month to each claimant qualified as 9 of the beginning of such fiscal year. For the purpose of 10 computation and payment of benefits under this act, if 11 12 children of any volunteer fireman shall become eligible for benefits hereunder, then all children of such volunteer 13 fireman shall be treated collectively as one (1) claimant. 14 15 The fiscal year for the purpose of this act shall begin on the first day of July of each year and end on the last day 16 of June of each year." 17

18 Section 3. Section 4, chapter 95, Laws of 1977, is amended to read as follows:

22 *11-2030. Fire insurance premium tax to be paid into 23 fund. The state auditor and ex officio commissioner of 24 insurance of the state of Montana shall annually deposit in 25 the agency volunteer firements fund, such sum as shall be equivalent to five per cent (5%) of premium taxes collected from insurers authorized to effect insurance against risks enumerated in section 11-1919, as shall remain after the amounts provided for by section 11-1919 shall have been first deducted. Whenever at the close of business on the 2 last day of any fiscal year there shall be a balance in the 3 volunteer fireman's--compensation--account--in--the--agency 4 firemen's fund in excess of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) then the industrial accident board shall set aside and pay 5 over to the public employees' retirement system, the smaller 6 of such amount in excess of one million dollars 7 (\$1,000,000), or an amount equal to ninety-five percent 8 (95%) of the increase of said account balance over the 9 account balance at the end of the preceding fiscal year, for 10 the payment by said public employees' retirement system of 11 12 pensions to qualified claimants during the immediately 13 succeeding fiscal year. The amount to be paid to each 14 qualifying claimant shall be determined by dividing said 15 amount set aside by the number of claimants qualifying to participate in such pension plan at the beginning of such 16 17 succeeding fiscal year. If such amount set aside shall be sufficient to pay each such qualified claimant at least 18 19 twenty dollars (\$20) per month throughout such succeeding 20 fiscal year, then such pension shall be paid monthly, on or 21 before the last day of each month of such succeeding fiscal 22 year; but if said amount set aside shall not be sufficient 23 to pay each qualified claimant at least twenty dollars (\$20) per month, then each qualified claimant's full pension for 24 25 that year shall be paid to him in one lump payment on or

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before the fifteenth day of December of such year; provided, 1 2 however, that in any event the total pension payable 3 hereunder to any qualified claimant shall not exceed the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) per month, and the amount to be set 4 aside hereunder from the volunteer fireman*s-compensation 5 account-in-the-agency firemen's fund at the beginning of any 6 fiscal year for the funding of such pensions shall not in 7 any event exceed the amount necessary to pay such maximum of 8 9 fifty dollars (\$50) per month to each claimant qualified as 10 of the beginning of such fiscal year. For the purpose of computation and payment of benefits under this act, if 11 children of any volunteer fireman shall become eligible for 12 13 benefits hereunder, then all children of such volunteer 14 fireman shall be treated collectively as one (1) claimant. The fiscal year for the purpose of this act shall begin on 15 the first day of July of each year and end on the last day 16 17 of June of each year."
