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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
12	Section 1. Section 87-1-201, NCA, is amended to read:
13	#87-1-201. Powers and duties. (1) The department shall
14	supervise all the wildlife, fish, game, game and nongame
15	birds, waterfowl, and the game and fur-bearing animals of
16	the state whether they are privately or publicly owned and
17	whether or not they have been reduced to captivity. It
18	possesses all powers necessary to fulfill the duties
19	prescribed by law and to bring actions in the proper courts
20	of this state for the enforcement of the fish and game laws
21	and the rules adopted by the department.
22	(2) It shall enforce all the laws of the state
23	respecting the protection, preservation, and propagation of
24	fish, game, fur-bearing animals, and game and nongame birds
25	within the state.

- (3) It shall have the exclusive power to spend for the protection, preservation, and propagation of fish, game, fur-bearing animals, and game and nongame birds all state funds collected or acquired for that purpose, whether arising from state appropriation, licenses, fines, gifts, or otherwise. Moneys collected or received from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses or permits, from the sale of seized game or hides, from fines or damages collected for violations of the fish and game laws, from appropriations, or received by the department from any other sources are appropriated to and under control of the department.
- (4) It may discharge any appointee or employee of the department for cause at any time.
- (5) It may dispose of all property owned by the state used for the protection, preservation, and propagation of fish, game, fur-bearing animals, and game and nongame birds which is of no further value or use to the state and shall turn over the proceeds from the sale to the state treasurer to be credited to the fish and game account in the earmarked revenue fund.
- 21 (6) It may not issue permits to anyone to carry 22 firearms within this state except to regularly appointed 23 officers or wardens.
 - (7) The department is hereby authorized to make, promulgate, and enforce such reasonable rules and

- regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this
 [act] as in its judgment will accomplish the purpose of this
 [act].
 - (8) The department is authorized to promulgate rules relative to tagging possession or transportation of bear within or without the state."
