Before transportation service may commence, pertinent

contract information shall be furnished to the commission

for each contract on forms prescribed by the commission. The

commission shall retain a duplicate of the information in

its files, and a copy of the form, confirmed by the

commission, must be kept in the cab of the motor carrier

when operating under that contract.

- (2) All Class C motor carriers must annually submit to the commission the names and addresses of all persons, corporations, or other legal entities with whom the Class C carrier has executed a contract, charter, agreement, or undertaking for the distribution, delivery, or collection of wares, merchandise, or commodities or for transporting persons.
 - (3) The provisions of this section requiring-certain Class-E-motor-certiers-to-operate--under--e-Class--B--motor corrier-certificate-ond-to-submit-an-annual-statement-to-the commission shall not apply to solid waste contractors, household goods carriers, or house movers, as defined by the department of public service regulation, or any carrier whose authority is confined by certificate to transportation within a distance of 50 miles or less from a particular location and that is performing pickup and delivery service under contract for one or more common carriers within that

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l area."
