9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
10 Section 1. Section 69-3-101, MCA, is amended to read:
11 "69-3-101. Meaning of term public utility. The term
12 "public utility", within the meaning of this chapter, shall
13 embrace every corporation, both public and private, company,
14 individual, association of individuals, their lessees,
15 trustees, or receivers appointed by any court whatsoever,
16 that now or hereafter may own, operate, or control any plant
17 or equipment or any part of a plant or equipment within the
18 state for the production, delivery, or furnishing for or to
19 other persons, firms, associations, or corporations, private
20 or municipal:
21 (1) heat;
22 (2) street-railway service;
23 (3) light;
24 (4) power in any form or by any agency;
25 (5) water for business, manufacturing, household use,

1 or sewerage service, whether within the limits of
2 municipalities, towns, and villages or elsewhere;
3 (6) sewage disposal service;
4 ~~(6)~~(7) telegraph or telephone service."

FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request received January 24, 1979, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 56 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A proposal to include sewers in the definition of regulated utilities.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. There will be 150 new utilities to regulate.
2. The Public Service Commission will need $3\frac{1}{2}$ additional FTEs.
3. Revenue per year will be \$1,055, derived from filing fees (40/year) and report fees.
4. There will be 40 new rate cases per year.

FISCAL IMPACT:
