In compliance with a written request received <u>January 24, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 56</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A proposal to include sewers in the definition of regulated utilities.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There will be 150 new utilities to regulate.
- 2. The Publice Service Commission will need 3¹/₂ additional FTEs.
- 3. Revenue per year will be \$1,055, derived from filing fees (40/year) and report fees.
- 4. There will be 40 new rate cases per year.
