DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

A proposal to exempt 10 personal staff of the Public Service Commission from certain provisions of the state employment classification and pay plan.

Assumptions:

- (1) The Commission would exempt six positions from the pay plan in the 1980-1981 biennium; three attorneys, Administrator of the Utility Division, Administrator of the Transportation Division and the Utility Division's Economist.
- (2) Two attorneys would receive a flat sum of \$20,000/year and the other attorney would receive \$25,000/year for the biennium. These attorneys would in turn sign a contract to remain with the Commission for a period of five years, the last three years of which they would be payed the higher of the above contract amounts or the pay plan wage.
- (3) Each Administrator would receive \$1,000/year increase over the present pay plan amounts.
- (4) The Economist would be payed the same wage as is presently payed the Commission's CPA.
