In compliance with a written request received <u>February 13, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 106</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

This revision is being submitted to reflect the additional costs to the Department of Revenue due to the proposed legislation.

★ DESCRIPTION:

This proposed bill provides funds for the preservation and management of nongame wildlife in Montana.

ASSUMPTION:

Adoption of the proposed income tax refund checkoff for nongame wildlife would necessitate increased expenditures by the Department of Revenue amounting to at least \$2,000 for forms and instructions, and another \$2,000 for data processing; presumably, these expenditures would be funded by an appropriation from the General Fund.
