1 HOUSE BILL NO. 115
2 INTRODUCED BY Wilson-----

4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OF
5 CERTAIN LOW NUTRITIONAL FOOD ON SCHOOL PREMISES AND TO
6 REQUIRE THE ADOPTION OF STANDARDS TO REGULATE THE TYPES OF
7 FOOD SOLD ON SCHOOL PREMISES."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Low nutritional food defined. As used in
11 [this act], "low nutritional food" means, but is not limited
12 to:

- 13 (1) carbonated drinks;
- 14 (2) candy;
- 15 (3) flavored ice bars;
- 16 (4) gum containing sugar.

17 Section 2. Sale of low nutrition food prohibited.
18 Trustees may not permit the sale of low nutritional food on
19 any elementary or secondary public school premises during
20 the regular school day through a vending machine, by any
21 means of direct sale, or otherwise.

22 Section 3. Trustees to adopt standards. (1) The
23 trustees of a school district shall adopt and enforce
24 standards governing the types of food that may be sold on
25 the premises of its schools.

1 (2) In adopting the standards, the trustees shall
2 consider the nutritional value of each type of food to be
3 precluded. No food may be sold on any school premises except
4 in accordance with the standards adopted by the trustees.

5 Section 4. Board of public education to formulate
6 guidelines. The board of public education shall formulate
7 and adopt guidelines which trustees may follow in enforcing
8 and implementing [this act].

9 Section 5. Codification. Sections 1 through 5 are
10 intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 20, and
11 the provisions contained in Title 20 apply to sections 1
12 through 5.
