A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION FROM APPROVING STANDBY CHARGES FUR CUSTOMERS WHO USE FORMS OF RENEWABLE ENERGY OTHER THAN THOSE PROVIDED BY REGULATED UTILITIES; REQUIRING UTILITIES TO PROVIDE STANDBY SERVICE AT REGULAR RATES TO ALL CONSUMERS WHO REQUEST IT; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

- (1) "Standby charge" means a charge, different than those charges generally authorized for service under a utility's tariffs, imposed when:
- (a) utility service is provided only when any other form or source of energy from any supply which is predominantly relied upon by the utility customer is not available to that customer; or
- (b) utility service is provided on a regular basis as the customer's predominate energy source but is subject to periodic partial or complete curtailment, at the customer's option, and replacement by another form or source of energy.
  - (2) "Standby service" means utility service provided

as an alternative or backup form or source of energy to the form or source of renewable energy predominantly relied upon by a customer.

Section 2. Approval of standby charges prohibited. The public service commission may not approve standby charges that penalize customers who use forms of renewable energy from sources other than those provided by regulated utilities.

Section 3. Utilities to provide standby service upon request. Unless specifically required by order of a federal regulatory agency, no utility may refuse service to a requesting customer solely on the grounds that the request is for standby service.

Section 4. Application — industrial customers exempted. The provisions of [this act] apply to all requests for standby charges and standby service for residential and commercial classes of customers but do not apply to requests for standby charges and standby service for industrial customers.

20 Section 5. Effective date. This act is effective on 21 passage and approval.

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
