In compliance with a written request received January 19, 1979, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 222 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to require the Department of Natural Resources to establish a program for the removal of silt from reservoirs behind dams.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The Department of Natural Resources will require six additional FTE employees to develop and implement the required program.
2. Two years will be needed to establish the program.
3. Twenty reservoirs will be studied during the two years.
4. Technical assistance provided private persons and governmental agencies in establishing programs for particular dams will be minimal.
