10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Single-member trustee
12 district required. (1) Each trustee of a school district
13 with a population of 10,000 or more must be elected from a
14 single-member district which is apportioned by population.

15 (2) The trustee must reside within the boundaries of
16 the single-member trustee district he represents.

17 (3) The boundaries of each single-member trustee
18 district shall be established by the county superintendent
19 of schools.

20 Section 2. Section 20-3-305, MCA, is amended to read:

21 "20-3-305. Candidate qualification and nomination. (1)
22 Any Except as provided in [section 1], any person who is
23 qualified to vote in a district under the provisions of
24 20-20-301 shall be eligible for the office of trustee.

25 (2) Any five electors qualified under the provisions

1 of 20-20-301 of any district, except a first-class
2 elementary district, may nominate as many trustee candidates
3 as there are trustee positions subject to election at the
4 ensuing election. The name of each person nominated for
5 candidacy shall be submitted to the clerk of the district
6 not less than 20 days before the regular school election day
7 at which he is to be a candidate. If there are different
8 terms to be filled, the term for which each candidate is
9 nominated shall also be indicated."
