BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Permit fee for paddlefish or white sturgeon. Whenever the commission establishes limits on the possession of paddlefish or white sturgeon or limits the number of paddlefish or white sturgeon that may be taken during a season, the department may charge a fee of \$5 for a permit issued by it to administer those limits.

Section 2. Codification. It is intended that section 1 be codified as an integral part of Title 87. chapter 2. part 3. and the provisions of Title 87. chapter 2. apply to section 1.

In compliance with a written request received <u>January 26, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 173</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION:

HB 173 is an act authorizing the Department of Fish and Game to enforce an annual limit on paddlefish and white sturgeon by issuing sets of tags for these species at \$5 per set.

ASSUMPTION:

- 1. The act would be effective May 1, 1980 and the Department would first use the authority in FY 1981.
- 2. No tags would be issued for white sturgeon in the coming biennium because fishing for that species will be closed effective May 19, 1979.
- 3. 5,000 resident and nonresident anglers now fish for paddlefish and would purchase tags if they were required.
- 4. 10,000 sets of tags would have to be printed in order to furnish sufficient numbers to all dealers likely to sell them. 10,000 tags would cost \$3,000 at todays prices.
