In compliance with a written request received <u>March 1, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 174 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 174 would submit a constitutional referendum to establish a 60 day legislative session for budget and financing bills and a 60 day session for general bills. The \* two sessions would constitute one complete Legislature. The first sessions under the provision would be in 1981 and 1982.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. 90 day costs for 1981 were assumed to be the same as 1979 anticipated costs.
- 2. 60 day estimates were based on current rates of pay.
- 3. Very few substantive bills (non-budget) would be approved for introduction in 1981.
- 4. Only one pre-session caucus would be held, that in 1980.
- Only one set of journals and session laws would be published, in 1982. 5.
- Both sessions would run the full 60 days authorized. 6.
- Legislators would be authorized two round trips home each session. 7.
- The Legislature would continue to meet 6 days a week. 8.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost of submitting the proposed amendment to the electors in November, 1980, is minimal. If the amendment is adopted, there will be the following fiscal impact.
