A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING UNIFORM AGE REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRANCE INTO ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE STATE OF MONTANA: PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE: AND AMENDING SECTIONS 20-1-101, 20-5-101, 20-7-117, AND 20-9-313, MCA.\*

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 9

Section 1. Section 20-1-101, MCA, is amended to read: 10 "20-1-101. Definitions. As used in this title, unless 11 the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following 12 definitions apply: 13

- (1) "Agricultural experiment station" means the agricultural experiment station established at Montana state university.
- (2) "Average number belonging" or "ANB" shall mean the average number of regularly enrolled, full-time pupils attending the public schools of a district.
