9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Election material -- party designation
11 required. (1) All communications advocating the election of
12 a candidate for a public office elected on a partisan basis,
13 including communications carried by any broadcasting
14 station, newspaper, magazine, outdoor advertising facility,
15 direct mailing, poster, handbill, bumper sticker, or other
16 form of general political advertising, must clearly and
17 conspicuously state the party affiliation of the candidate.

18 (2) If the document or other article of advertising is
19 too small to conveniently carry the full name of the
20 political party, the recognized abbreviation or an initial
21 may be used to designate the candidate's party affiliation.
