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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL CAMPAIGN MATERIAL OF A CANDIDATE FOR A PUBLIC OFFICE ELECTED ON A PARTISAN BASIS TO CARRY THE CANDIDATE'S POLITICAL PARTY AFFILIATION."

House BILL NO. 193

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Election material -- party designation required. (1) All communications advocating the election of a candidate for a public office elected on a partisan basis, including communications carried by any broadcasting station, newspaper, magazine, outdoor advertising facility, direct mailing, poster, handbill, bumper sticker, or other form of general political advertising, must clearly and conspicuously state the party affiliation of the candidate.

(2) If the document or other article of advertising is too small to conveniently carry the full name of the political party, the recognized abbreviation or an initial may be used to designate the candidate's party affiliation.
