### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 211 is an act to increase the salaries of the 49 elected officials of the executive and judicial branch of state government.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- There are four associate justices of the Supreme Court.
- 2. There are five Public Service Commissioners.
- There are 32 district court judges which includes one Workers' Compensation judge.
- 4. Employer benefit payments are 10% of total salaries.
