A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE BOARD OF PUBLIC EDUCATION TO APPROVE VOCATIONAL EDUCATON PROGRAMS AT MONTANA STATE PRISON; PROVIDING FOR THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERINTENDANT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 20-7-301 AND 20-7-302. MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-7-301. MCA, is amended to read:

#20-7-301. Duties of board of public education. The
board of public education shall be the governing board of
the state of Montana for vocational education. The board of
public education shall adopt policies to effect the orderly
development of a system of vocational education that is
adaptable to changing needs, controlled to prevent
unnecessary duplication, coordinated with federal guidelines
and requirements for vocational education, and funded to
ensure growth and quality programming. In order to
accomplish the orderly development of a system of vocational
education, the board of public education policies shall
include:

- (1) a state plan for such development;
- (2) standards for vocational education courses and

- courses and programs which are to receive financial assistance;

- (7) a system of evaluation of vocational education which allows for consideration of the current and projected manpower needs and job opportunities; and
