be it enacted by the legislature of the state df montana:
Section 1. Section 16-4-105. MCAF is amended to read:
"16-4-105. Limit on retail beer licenses - wine license amendments -- off-premises consumptione (1) Except as otherwise provided by law, a license to sell beer at retail or beer and wine at retail. in accordance with the provisions of this code and the rules of the department, may be issued to any person, firm, or corporation who is approved by the department as a fit and proper person, firm. or corporation to sell beef, except that:
(a) the number of retail beer licenses that the department may issue for prenises situated within incorporated cities and incorporated towns and within a distance of 5 mines from the corporate limits of such cities and towns shall be determined on the basis of population as shown by tre most recent official United states census
authorized by congress, as follows:
(i) in incorporated towns of 500 inhabitants or less and within a distance of 5 mites from the corporate limits of such towns, not sore than one retail beer license, which may not be used in conjunction with a retail all-beverages license:
(ii) in incorporated cities or incorporated towns of more than 500 inhabitants and not ovet 2,000 inhabitants and within a distance of 5 miles from the corporate limits of such cities or townsy one beer license for each 500 inhabitants, which eay not be used in conjunction with retail all-beverages licenses:
(ili) in incorporated cities of over 2,000 inhabitants and within a distance of 5 miles from the corporate limits of such cities, two additional retail beer licenses for the first 2,000 inhabitants or major fraction thereof and one additional retail beer license for each additional 2,000 inhabitants, which way not be used in conjunction with retail all-beverages licenses;
(b) the number of the inhabitants in such cities and towns exclusive of the number of inhabitants residing within a distance of 5 miles from the corporate limits thereof, shall govern the number of retail beer licenses that may be issued for use within such cities and towns and within a distance of 5 wiles from the corporate limits
thereofe lf two or more incorporated municipalities are situated within a distance of 5 miles fromeach other. the total number of retail beer licenses that may be issued for use in both of such municipalities and within a distance of 5 miles from their respective corporate limits shall be determined on the basis of the combined poputations of both of such municipalities and may not exceed the foregoing limitations. The distance of 5 miles from the corporate limits of any incorporated city or incorporated town shall be measured in a straight line from the nearest entrance of the premises proposed for licensing to the nearest corporate boundery of such city or town.
(c) retail beer licenses of issue on March 7, 1947, and which are in excess of the foregoing lieitations shall be renewable, but no new licenses may be issued in violation of such liattations;
(3) such limitations do not prevent the issuance of a nontransferable and nonassignable retail beer license to a post of nationally chartered veterans* organization or a lodge of a recognized national fraternal organization if such veterans: or fraternal organization has been in existence for a period of 5 years or more prior to January 1. 1949;
(e) the number of retail beer licenses that the department may issue for use at premises situated outside of
> any incorporated city or incorporated town and outside of the area within a distance of 5 miles from the corparate limits thereof or for use at premises situated within any unincorporated town shall be as determined by the department in the exercise of its sound discretion except that no retail beer license may be issued for any premises so situated unless the department determines that the issuance of such license is required by public convenience and necesstty.
> (2) A person holding a license to sell beer for consumption on the premises at retail may apply to the department for an amendment to the license permitting the molder to sell wine as well as beer. The division may issue such amendment if it finds, on a satisfactory showing by the applicant, that the sale of wine for consumption on the premises would be supplementary to a restaurant or prepared-food business. A persan holding a beer-and-wine license may sell wine for consumption on the premises. He may buy wine only at retail from the department. Nonretention of the beer license, for whatever reason, shall mean automatic loss of the wine amendment license.
> (3) A retail iicense to sell beer in the original packages for off-preaises consumption only may be issued to any person, firm, or corporation who is approved by the department as a fit and proper person, firmi, or corporation

## DESCRIPTITON

This proposed bill provides that stores possessing a retail store license may be licensed for the sale of beer for off-premises consumption.

## ASSUMPTIONS

1) There are approximately 10,000 retail store licenses in the state, so there is a potential for 10,000 licenses to sell beer for off-premise consumption.
2) At present there are 700 establishments licensed to sell beer for off-premise consumption.
3) Additional licenses to sell beer for off-premise consumption of 400 for FY 80 and 300 for FY81.
4) A fee of $\$ 200$ for a 11 cense to sell beer for off-premise consumption.
5) Administrative costs will increase $\$ 1000$ for each year of the biennium.
