12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NONTANA:

Section 1. Unfair trade practice prohibited. A milk
 distributor or producer may not engage in an unfair trade
 practice.

Section 2. Rules of fair trade practices -- milk distributors and producers. (1) The department of business regulation may adopt, amend, and repeal rules governing fair trade practices as they pertain to the transaction of business among milk producers, distributors, and the general public.
