When a community college 11 12 district has territory in more than one county, the board of 13 county commissioners of each county shall fix and levy the 14 community college district tax on all the real and personal 15 property of the community college district situated in its 16 county."

Section 7. Section 20-15-308, MCA, is amended to read: "20-15-308. Deposit of moneys money. Community college district moneys money shall be deposited with the county treasurer of the county where the community college is located-or-with-other-depositories-approved-by-the*regents."

In compliance with a written request received <u>February 7, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 293</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 293 defines the mandatory levy for a community college as that portion taken together with some other local income which makes up 35% of the <u>legislative</u> budget as apposed to the regent's budget under current law.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Shifts 65/35 funding from Regents approved budgets to legislative approved budget.

2. May require some changes in county chart of accounts.

FISCAL IMPACT:

None at the state level.

LOCAL IMPACT:

- 1. Could reduce mandated levies at local level and shift these revenues to voted levies.
- 2. Could require additional costs at the local level because the bill references the state fund structure which may require some accounting changes.
