1 STATEMENT OF INTENT RE: HB 337

4 A statement of intent is not required for House Bill
5 337 in that it does not grant additional rulemaking
6 authority. However, the Senate State Administration
7 Committee voted to attach a statement in accordance with
8 Joint Rule 11-2.

9 1. It is the intent of the Committee that this
10 legislation shall apply only to those spouses who never had
11 available to them the option of participating in the Highway
12 Patrolmen's Retirement System covered by Chapter 349, Laws
13 of 1975.

14 2. It is, further, the intent of the Committee that
15 the administrators of the Highway Patrolmen's Retirement
16 System shall avoid seeking benefits for those persons who
17 have failed to take advantage of the option of participating
18 in the Highway Patrolmen's Retirement System.

19 Adopted by the Committee on State Administration of the
20 Senate on the 5th day of March, 1979.
