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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO ADOPT A CODE OF FAIR CAMPAIGN PRACTICES AND TO PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL CANDIDATES TO SUBSCRIBE TO THAT CODE."

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BE IT ERACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Adoption of code of fair campaign practices. The following code of fair campaign practices is adopted by Montana:

There are basic principles of decency, honesty, and fair play that every candidate for public office in the United States has a moral obligation to observe and uphold, in order that, after vigorously contested but fairly conducted campaigns, our citizens may exercise their constitutional right to a free and untrammeled choice and the will of the people may be fully and clearly expressed on the issues before the country. Therefore:

I shall conduct my campaign in the best American tradition, discussing the issues as I see them, presenting my record and policies with sincerity and frankness, and criticizing without fear or favor the record and policies of my opponent and his party which merit such criticism.

I shall defend and uphold the right of every qualified

I shall condemn the use of personal vilification,

character defamation, whispering campaigns, libel, slander,

or scurrilous attacks on any candidate or his personal or

family life.

I shall condemn the use of campaign material of any sort which misrepresents, distorts, or otherwise falsifies the facts regarding any candidate, as well as the use of malicious or unfounded accusations against any candidate which aim at creating or exploiting doubts, without justification, as to his loyalty and patriotism.

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I shall condemn any dishonest or unethical practice which tends to corrupt or undermine our American system of free elections or which hampers or prevents the full and free expression of the will of the voters.

I shall immediately and publicly repudiate support deriving from any individual or group which resorts, on behalf of my candidacy or in apposition to that of my opponent, to the methods and tactics that I condemn.

Section 2. Candidates to be given opportunity to

subscribe to campaign practices code -- publicity. (1) The

commissioner of campaign practices shall prepare a form

which contains the code of fair campaign practices provided for in [section 1] and a place for a candidate to sign the form and to indicate that the candidate endorses, subscribes to, and pledges to abide by the code.

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- (2) Each candidate required to file statements or reports with the commissioner shall be sent a copy of this form. Signing the form is voluntary, and a failure or refusal to sign is not a violation of the election laws. A form shall be sent for each election as soon as feasible. The signed form shall be returned to the commissioner.
- (3) The commissioner shall supply the secretary of state, the county registrars, and the city and town clerks with forms. Any candidate not required to file with the commissioner but wishing to subscribe to the code may obtain the form from the commissioner, the secretary of state, a county registrar, or a city or town clerk and may sign the form and deliver it to the commissioner.
- (4) The commissioner shall publicize the code and its contents and shall inform the public of the names of all candidates who have signed the form and subscribe to the code.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

House Bill 350 provides for the adoption of a Code of Fair Campaign Practices and provides an opportunity for all candidates to voluntarily subscribe to that code.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- Proposed legislation can be administered through current level FTE of the Office of Commissioner of Campaign Finances and Practices.
- Form required for distribution to candidates can be reproduced on front 2. and reverse side of a single  $8\frac{1}{2}$  x 11 sheet.
- Each candidate will have to be furnished with 3 copies of the oath--those desiring to voluntarily subscribe to the oath will file a copy with the Commissioner and their county clerk and will maintain a copy for their own record.
- Printing of Code for all candidates participating in elections during FY 80 and 81 will be printed in FY 80.
