Description of Proposed Legislation:

House Bill 380 designates that the Department of Highways bear the entire cost of maintenance, operation, and construction of all traffic control devices in the state maintenance system.

#### Assumptions:

- 1. No increase in personnel required.
- 2. Cities will do the work on accounts receivable basis for replacement of signs on state maintained system through cities.
- 3. Street name signs, parking regulation signs & cities' points of interest signs will remain the responsibility of the city.
- 4. All regulatory & warning signs will be eligible for reimbursement.
- 5. Estimate 66 signs per mile with 195 miles on State Maintained System equals 12,870 signs to maintain.
- 6. Consider post replacement @ 3%=386 per year.
- 7. Consider sign replacement on average life expectancy of 7 years or 15%=1920 per year.
- 8. 220 Traffic Signals on State Maintained System.
