4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY  
5 FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1981;  
6 PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS;  
7 AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

8  
9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this act,  
11 unless otherwise stated the following definitions apply:

12 (1) "Agency" includes each state office, department,  
13 board, commission, council, committee, unit of the  
14 university system, or other entity or instrumentality of the  
15 executive branch, office of the legislative branch, or  
16 office of the judicial branch of state government.

17 (2) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or  
18 improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation,  
19 furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.

20 (3) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the  
21 budget Director of a request submitted through the  
22 Architecture and Engineering Division of the Department of  
23 Administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a  
24 capital project within an agency to increase the  
25 appropriations of another capital project within that agency

1 or to obtain financing to expand a project from funds which  
2 were not available for consideration by the Legislature but  
3 which have become available.

4 (4) "BPICA" means account number 06142 in the bond  
5 proceeds and insurance clearance fund; "FPRA" means federal  
6 and private revenue account; and "ERA" means earmarked  
7 revenue account.

8 Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No  
9 existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of  
10 the project as approved by the 46th Legislature unless the  
11 capital project expansion is authorized by an approved  
12 budget amendment.

13 Section 3. Additional funding. If a capital project is  
14 jointly financed by an appropriation or appropriations from  
15 state sources as well as by appropriations from other  
16 sources, the funds provided by appropriation from state  
17 sources shall be decreased by the amount that the funds  
18 received from other sources exceed the amount appropriated  
19 by the Legislature in the 1979 biennial budget if the  
20 decrease does not jeopardize the receipt of the funds to be  
21 received from other sources.

22 Section 4. Federal funds for administration. All  
23 federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of  
24 administering the federal funds when the cost was financed  
25 from the general fund shall revert to the general fund.

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INTRODUCED BILL

1 Section 5. Reappropriation. Notwithstanding any other  
 2 provision of law, the remaining balances on capital projects  
 3 previously appropriated are hereby reappropriated until June  
 4 30, 1981, for the purposes for which originally  
 5 appropriated.

6 Section 6. Revenue sharing appropriation. There is  
 7 appropriated from the federal revenue sharing capital  
 8 construction account number 04001 to account number 06142 in  
 9 the bond proceeds and insurance clearance fund \$308,000 to  
 10 be used with other available funds to support the projects  
 11 provided below.

12 Section 7. Construction and maintenance appropriation.

HOUSE BILL NO. 417

INTRODUCED BY BARDANOUVE

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1981; PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

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(3) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the Budget Director of a request submitted through the Architecture and Engineering Division of the Department of Administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a capital project within an agency to increase the appropriations of another capital project within that agency

or to obtain financing to expand a project from funds which were not available for consideration by the Legislature but which have become available.

(4) "BPICA" means account number 06142 in the bond proceeds and insurance clearance fund; "FPRA" means federal and private revenue account; and "ERA" means earmarked revenue account; AND "OTHER APPROPRIATED FUNDS" MEANS MONEY OTHER THAN GENERAL FUND OR BPICA MONEY THAT ACCRUE UNDER PROVISIONS OF LAW TO AN AGENCY INDICATED HEREIN.

Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of the project as approved by the 46th Legislature unless the capital project expansion is authorized by an approved budget amendment.

Section 3. Additional funding. If a capital project is jointly financed by an appropriation or appropriations from state sources as well as by appropriations from other sources, the funds provided by appropriation from state sources shall be decreased by the amount that the funds received from other sources exceed the amount appropriated by the Legislature in the 1979 biennial budget if the decrease does not jeopardize the receipt of the funds to be received from other sources.

HOUSE BILL NO. 417  
INTRODUCED BY BARDANOUVE

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1981; PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this act, unless otherwise stated the following definitions apply:

(1) "Agency" includes each state office, department, board, commission, council, committee, unit of the university system, or other entity or instrumentality of the executive branch, office of the legislative branch, or office of the judicial branch of state government.

(2) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation, furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.

(3) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the Budget Director of a request submitted through the Architecture and Engineering Division of the Department of Administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a capital project within an agency to increase the appropriations of another capital project within that agency

or to obtain financing to expand a project from funds which were not available for consideration by the Legislature but which have become available.

(4) "BPICA" means account number 06142 in the bond proceeds and insurance clearance fund; "FPRA" means federal and private revenue account; and "ERA" means earmarked revenue account; ~~AND "OTHER APPROPRIATED FUNDS" MEANS MONEY OTHER THAN GENERAL FUND OR BPICA MONEY THAT ACCRUE UNDER PROVISIONS OF LAW TO AN AGENCY INDICATED HEREIN.~~

Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of the project as approved by the 46th Legislature unless the capital project expansion is authorized by an approved budget amendment.

Section 3. Additional funding. If a capital project is jointly financed by an appropriation or appropriations from state sources as well as by appropriations from other sources, the funds provided by appropriation from state sources shall be decreased by the amount that the funds received from other sources exceed the amount appropriated by the Legislature in the 1979 biennial budget if the decrease does not jeopardize the receipt of the funds to be received from other sources.

Section 4. Federal funds for administration. All federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of

1 administering the federal funds when the cost was financed  
 2 from the general fund shall revert to the general fund.

3 Section 5. Reappropriation. Notwithstanding any other  
 4 provision of law, the remaining balances on capital projects  
 5 previously appropriated are hereby reappropriated until June

8 Section 6. Revenue sharing appropriation. There is
