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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 39-51-2104, MCA, TO MAKE A PERSON INELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION BENEFITS FOR 3 MONTHS FROM DATE OF UNEMPLOYMENT IF HIS GROSS INCOME IN THE PRECEDING THREE

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BE IT FNACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

QUARTERS EXCEEDS \$20,000.*

Section 1. Section 39-51-2104, MCA: is amended to 11 read: 12

#39-51-2104. General benefit eligibility conditions. an unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits for any week of total unemployment within his benefit year only if the division finds that:

(1) he has registered for work at and thereafter has continued to report at an employment office in accordance with such regulation as the division may prescribe, except that the division may, by regulation, prescribe that such types of cases or situations with respect to which it finds that compliance with such requirements would be oppressive, or would be inconsistent with the purposes of this chapter, provide for registration and reporting for work by mail or through other governmental agencies;

- (2) he has made a claim for benefits in accordance with the provisions of 39-51-2401;
 - (3) he is able to work and is available for work and is seeking work; provided, however, that no claimant shall be considered ineligible in any week of unemployment for failure to comply with the provisions of this subsection if such failure is due to an illness or disability which occurs after he has registered for work and no suitable work has been offered to such claimant after the beginning of such illness or disability;
- (4) prior to any week for which he claims benefits he has been totally unemployed for a waiting period of 1 week. However, if claimant's benefit year expires during a period of compensable unemployment, claimant will continue to receive weekly benefits in a new benefit year, if otherwise eligible, without interruption to serve the waiting week for the new benefit year but will thereafter be required to serve the waiting week before receiving benefits during subsequent unemployment in the new benefit year. No week shall be counted as a week of total unemployment for the purposes of this subsection:
- (a) if benefits have been paid with respect thereto;
- (b) unless the individual was eligible for benefits 23 with respect thereto; 24
- - (c) unless it occurs within the benefit year of the
