be renewed unless the sanitarian has certified upon a form
prescribed by the board that he has obtained the number of
hours of approved continuing education required by the
board.

10 (2) Upon adequate demonstration of good cause by the sanitarian for having failed to obtain the required number 11 of continuing education hours through attendance of 12 13 regularly accredited programs, the board shall renew the 14 license of a sanitarian who has completed an alternative program of compliance prescribed by the board. Alternative 15 16 programs shall insure competency essentially equivalent to 17 that gained through regularly accredited continuing education programs and may include home study courses. 18 19 examinations, or any other program prescribed by the board. 20 (3) The board shall adopt rules for the proper 21 administration of the continuing education provisions of 22 this chapter, including but not limited to:

23 (a) determining accredited programs;

(b) establishing the number of hours of continuing
education required for license renewal; and
