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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. State administration of vocational education. Vocational education must be administered according to the laws of Montana and the policies of the board of public education. If there is a conflict between the laws providing for vocational education and any other laws governing the operation of schools, the former controls.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Local advisory boards -torms and compensation. (1) There is a local advisory board
for each postsecondary vocational-technical center.

(2)	A local	advisory	board	consists	of :	seven	members
appointed	by the	board of	public	educatio	n in	the	followi ng
manner:							

- (a) three members must be members of the school district board of trustees in which a postsecondary vocational-technical center is located;
- 7 (b) four members must reside outside the county in 8 which a postsecondary vocational-technical center is 9 located; and
- (c) four members must be from occupations or professions that are not directly related to education.
 - (3) The director of a postsecondary vocational-technical center may not be a member of a local advisory board.
 - (4) (a) After initial appointments, the term of office of members of a local advisory board is 3 years beginning on the third Monday in April of the year appointed.
- 18 (b) For the purpose of making initial appointments of
 19 members to a local advisory board, the board of public
 20 education shall appoint three members to serve for 3 years,
 21 two members to serve for 2 years, and two members to serve
 22 for 1 year.
 - (5) Each member shall qualify by filing his oath of office with the board of public education.
 - (6) The board of public education may remove a local

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advisory board member.

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- 2 (7) All vacancies must be filled by appointment by a majority vote of the board of public education.
 - (8) Appointed members of a local advisory board are entitled to per diem and travel expenses, as provided in 2-18-501 through 2-18-503, for each day in attendance at board meetings or in the performance of any duty or service as a board member. The members must be reimbursed from the amount appropriated by the legislature for the maintenance and support of postsecondary vocational-technical centers.

 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Duties of local advisory boards. A local advisory board shall:
- (1) meet at least three times each year and more often
 if required;

 - (a) current employment needs in its area;

 programs.
- 8 NEW SECTION: Section 4. Retirement systems for 9 teachers and employees. (1) Postsecondary 10 vocational-technical center teachers are subject to, and 11 eligible for the benefits of, the Montana teachers* 12 retirement system.
- 13 (2) Postsecondary vocational-technical center
 14 employees not eligible for teachers' retirement system
 15 benefits are subject to, and eligible for the benefits of,
 16 the Montana public employees' retirement system.
- 17 NEW SECTION. Section 5. Agreements for 115 e i 18 services or facilities. The board of public education and a 19 school district board may enter into agreements for the use 20 by eitner of the other's services, facilities, or equipment 21 and for the presentation of courses of either for students 22 of the other whenever such agreements are considered to be in the best educational interests of the students involved. 23 24 NEW SECTION. Section 6. Construction of [part] when portion thereof in conflict with federal requirements. If 25

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any portion of [this part] is found to be in conflict with federal requirements that are a condition precedent to the allocation of federal funds to the state, the conflicting portion is inoperative solely to the extent of the conflict, and the finding does not affect the operation of the remainder of [this part].

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NEW SECTION. Section 7. Teachers and other employees to continue performing usual duties. (1) All postsecondary vocutional-technical center teachers and other employees of an existing school district board affected by [this act] shall continue to perform their usual duties upon the same terms and conditions as they have prior to July 1, 1979, until removed or appointed to positions in accordance with the provisions of [section 20].

(2) Postsecondary vocational-technical center teachers tenured by a school district board shall continue to have the same tenure rights, duties, and obligations under employment with the board of public education as earned under the previous school district board.

NEW_SECTION: Section 8. Postsecondary vocational education fund 21. All funds remaining to the credit of postsecondary vocational education fund 21 on July 1, 1979, ore transferred to the board of public education.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 9. Contracts and obligations saved. (1) All existing contracts and obligations of an

existing department, state board, state officer, or school district board affected by [this act] remain in effect and must be performed by the respective department, state board, or state officer that succeeds to any of the powers and duties of such department, state board, state officer, or school district board.

(2) An employment contract for postsecondary vocational-technical center teachers or employees negotiated prior to July 1, 1979, and whose effective date is on or before July 1, 1979, remains in effect for the duration of the contract or until the teacher or employee is removed or appointed to another position in accordance with the provisions of [section 20].

NEW SECTION. Section 10. Reports required by law to be performed by successor agencies. All reports required by law to be made by any existing department, state board, state officer, or school district board affected by [this act] must, after July 1, 1979, be made by the executive and administrative head of the appropriate department, state board, or state officer prescribed by [this act].

NEW SECTION: Section 11. Records and pending business of agencies transferred. All books, papers, maps, charts, plans, and records in the possession of an existing department, state board, state officer, or school district board affected by [this act] or any officer or member

thereof and pending business in any way pertaining to the
previous powers and duties of such department, state board,
state officer, or school district board must be delivered
and transferred to the administrative and executive head of
the appropriate department, state board, or state officer
prescribed in [this act]. If any question orises as to the
proper custody of any such books, papers, maps, charts,
plans, records, or pending business, the governor shall
settle the dispute.
