Hinsch INTRODUCED 2 Rassinger united the market BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING THE TAKING OF GAME AND NONGAME FISH BY SPEAR OR GIG WHEN THE FISHERMAN IS SUBMERGED: PROVIDING THAT ANGLERS AND UNDERWATER FISHERMEN 6 SHALL BE TREATED EQUALLY; PROVIDING FOR UNDERWATER FISHING 7 LICENSES; AMENDING SECTIONS 87-2-301 THROUGH 87-2-304 AND 8 87-3-204. MCA.* 9

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11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 12 Section 1. Section 87-3-204. MCA, is amended to read: 13 *87-3-204. Restrictions on fishing methods. (1) No 14 game fish may be caught. captured. or taken or attempted to 15 be caught. captured. or taken by the aid or with the use of 16 any gun or trap. nor may any such set gun. trap. or other 17 device to entrap game fish be used. made. or set.

(2) It is unlawful for a person to take or catch fish 18 in any of the waters of this state, except with hook and 19 line held in hand or line and hook attached to rod or pole 20 held in hand; to take or catch fish with hook baited with 21 any poisonous substance or by means of the use of any 22 poisonous substance, including fish berries; or to take or 23 catch fish by means of the use of fishtraps, grabhooks, 24 seines, nets, or other similar means for catching fish. 25

1 (3) The department may designate such waters within 2 the state of Montana wherein, in the judgment of the ٦ departments spears or gigs may be used for taking waileved pikey-sougery-northern--pikey game and nongame fish and 5 traps, seines, nets, and rubber or spring-propelled spears, ٨ when employed by sportsmen swimming or submerged in the 7 may be used for the taking of designated species of water. 8 fish. The waters so designated may be closed at the 9 discretion of the department. The taking of all fish by such 10 means in the waters, when so designated, is to be done under 11 such rules as the department may prescribe with reference 12 thereto and under the supervision of the department. All 13 such mongame fish so taken may be possessed and sold in such 14 manner and under such restrictions as the department may 15 direct. All fish, other than those herein designated, so 16 taken under department rules, when prescribed by the 17 department, shall be returned uninjured to the waters from 16 which they were taken.

19 (4) The taking of black bass in Flathead Lake may be
20 permitted by the department.

(5) The department shall have the power to designate certain waters where setlines may be used to fish for certain species of game or nongame fish, and the department may designate the number of hooks and lines and the length of line or lines which may be used as setlines.

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1 (6) Game fish shall be taken only by angling, that is 2 by hook and single line in hand or single rod in hand or Э within immediate control. This does not prevent: however: (a) the snaqqing of paddlefish, coho (silver salmon). 4 5 and kokanee (sockeye salmon) when the department declares an 6 open season when paddlefish, coho (silver salmon), and 7 kokanee (sockeye salmon) may be taken by snagging; 8 (b) the taking of paddlefish with longbow and arrow 9 when the department declares an open season when paddlefish may be taken by longbow and arrow; 10 11 (c) the taking of walleyed--pikey--saugery-northern 12 pikey game and nongame fish with spear or gig when the 13 department declares an open season for taking watteved-sikey 14 sougery--northern--pikey game and nongame fish with spear or 15 qiq; 16 (d) the use of landing net or gaff to land a game fish 17 after the same has been hooked by angling as above 18 specified: or 19 (e) the taking of minnows other than game fish variety 20 by the use or aid of a net net to exceed 12 feet in length 21 and 4 feet in width in such waters as may be designated by

Section 3. Section 87-2-302, MCA, is amended to read: 16 *87-2-302. Class B--nonresident fishing license. [1] 17 18 Any person not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, upon payment of the sum of \$20 to any agent of the department 19 authorized to issue fishing and hunting licenses, shall be 20 21 entitled to a Class 8 license which shall entitle the holder 22 thereof to fish with hook and line as authorized by the 23 rules and regulations of the department. 24 (2) Upon payment of an additional \$3 fee, any

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entitles the holder to fish with gig or spear as authorized by the departments" Section 4. Section 87-2-303, MCA, is amended to read:

4 #87-2-303. Class 8-3--temporary nonresident or tourist fishing license. (1) Any person not a resident, as defined 5 in 87-2-102, upon payment of the sum of \$10 to any agent of 6 the department authorized to issue fishing and hunting 7 licenses, shall be entitled to a temporary nonresident 8 fishing license which shall authorize the holder to fish 9 with hook and line as authorized by the rules and 10 11 regulations of the department for a period of 6 days. inclusive of the dates indicated on the license. 12

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 nonresident shall receive an underwater temporary

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 nonresident fishing license that entitles the holder to fish

[1] Any person not a resident, as defined in 20 87-2-102, who is a holder of a valid wildlife conservation 21 license, upon payment of the sum of \$2 to any agent of the **2**2 department authorized to issue fishing and hunting licenses. 23 shall be entitled to a 1-day nonresident fishing license 24 which shall authorize the holder to fish with hook and line 25

- 2 1 calendar day as indicated on the license.
